






GLENN COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION





CHILD & FAMILY SERVICES: EARLY HEAD START AND HEADSTART

Glenn County Office of Education oversees and administers all early child care and education funds through Child and Family Services (CaFS) for Glenn County with the exception of a single State Preschool contract and Migrant Head Start program. In the 2023-2024 program year, **142 children were enrolled in Head Start/State Preschool and Early Head Start programs**, and approximately **654 children participated in subsidized child care offered through our Child Care Resource Referral and Payment Program**. All Head Start services are provided at no cost to families.



Developmental progress is monitored through teacher observations, a portfolio of each child's work, and parent input throughout the year. Emphasis is placed on building language and communication skills that will prepare children to be ready for Kindergarten.

EARLY FOUNDATIONS: PRESCHOOL, UPK & TK

Little Bridges Preschool proudly opened its doors in 2024, marking the beginning of an exciting journey. This full inclusion preschool is dedicated to creating a vibrant, supportive environment where every child's unique strengths and needs are celebrated. The goal of the program is for all students to learn, grow, and develop in an inclusive setting, while fostering connections between families in Glenn County—building bridges between those with special needs and others in the community. At Little Bridges, the belief is simple: "We are better together!"

A strong connection between home and school is the foundation for serving the whole child. Learning environments are intentionally crafted to offer physical and emotional security, supporting self-knowledge, self-control, and self-esteem, while encouraging respect for others. Safe, healthy environments with predictable routines are at the heart of creating trusting, positive learning experiences for all students.





Universal Pre-K (UPK) sets the stage for lifelong learning and offers flexible, high-quality options for 3- and 4-year-olds, catering to diverse family needs. Professional learning for educators ensures alignment with state standards, promoting effective early learning environments.

Transitional Kindergarten (TK) aims to provide a strong start for young learners before they enter kindergarten.

In preparation for the expansion of Transitional Kindergarten (TK) programs, significant efforts have been underway to ensure area schools are ready for the 2025-26 school year when a mandate requires all local educational agencies offer TK to all eligible four-year-old children. These efforts include professional development for teachers, with a focus on early childhood education, social-emotional learning, and inclusive classroom practices. Schools are also developing plans for full-day learning programs that meet the needs of parents, including partnerships with community-based early learning programs.

Additionally, funding is being utilized to create or expand TK programs and facilities, and to acquire necessary classroom materials and supplies. Fueled by robust planning and a dedication to our youngest learners, *Glenn County schools are ready for the challenge of Universal Transitional Kindergarten* and the opportunity to provide a strong educational foundation for all.

STUDENT SERVICES: SUPPORTING DIVERSE ABILITIES

Student Services at the Glenn County Office of Education is committed to fostering an inclusive, supportive, and engaging learning environment for students with diverse abilities across Glenn County.

Student Services strives to *empower students with disabilities to reach their full potential* in school and beyond. The team works closely with families, general education staff, and community resources to create a collaborative environment for student success. What makes Student Services unique is its *collaboration with every Local Education Agency in Glenn County* to deliver high-quality special education services tailored to the unique needs of each student at each campus.

Student Services also provides services to infants and preschool students across the county, in collaboration with the Child and Family Services department and the

Regional Center.

Upon graduation, Student Services aims for all students to understand their disability, their strengths, areas where they need help, the type of help they need, and how to articulate and advocate for their needs. Student Services offers professional development for teachers and support staff, collaborates with families to create individualized education plans (IEPs), and connects students with community resources. The staff consists of 163 dedicated individuals who strive to support and serve students every single day. Together, they continue to promote equity and excellence in education throughout Glenn County.

SPECIAL PROGRAMS: NURTURING THE WHOLE CHILD

Glenn County Office of Education offers a network of interconnected programs dedicated to ensuring *every student* in Glenn County can thrive. These programs work in concert to empower youth and strengthen communities.

GCOE's commitment to supporting the *whole child* is evident in programs that nurture well-being and positive development. *Friday Night Live (FNL)* and *Club Live*, operating at the high school and middle school levels respectively, foster positive relationships between youth and adults through mentorship and youth development opportunities.

Understanding that health is integral to academic success, the *Tobacco Use Prevention Education (TUPE) Program* educates students about the dangers of tobacco use, intervenes when use is identified, and provides cessation support. This comprehensive approach promotes healthy choices and empowers students to make informed decisions.

GCOE is deeply invested in supporting students facing unique challenges. The *Foster Youth Services Coordinating Program (FYSCP)* wraps around these vulnerable youth, ensuring they have the resources and advocacy needed to navigate their education. The program also assists with transitions between schools and into higher education or careers.

Recognizing that school attendance is paramount, the **School Attendance Review Board (SARB)** intervenes early to address attendance issues. This collaborative effort involves school personnel, families, law enforcement, and community organizations, keeping students engaged in learning and diverting them from the juvenile justice system.

School safety is paramount, and GCOE's dedicated Safety Coordinator works tirelessly with districts, law enforcement, and emergency services to ensure secure learning environments. This includes developing safety plans, conducting audits, and providing training on emergency preparedness, allowing students to focus on their education with peace of mind.

SPECIAL PROGRAMS: ALTERNATIVE PATHWAYS

William Finch Charter School operates as the Glenn County Independent Home Study program, offering K-12 students alternative to traditional public school. Their mission is based on the principle that all students should have access to the California public school curriculum, preparing them for a successful future. The flexible nature of charter schools allows administrators, faculty, staff, and parents to collaborate on designing a program that effectively addresses students' academic, social, personal, and career needs.

Glenn County Office of Education is proud to offer an alternative education setting through the *REACH program*, designed to accommodate students requiring *nontraditional educational pathways*. With the goal of promoting rehabilitation, personal development, and academic progress; and with the aim of reintegrating students into a traditional school setting or preparing them for the next steps in their educational journey.

Level 1 provides an alternative setting for students who have not yet succeeded in their home districts, creating a supportive environment with high expectations.

Level 2 is for students who have been expelled from their regular schools, offering a voluntary enrollment option at William Finch Charter School.

Level 3 is designed for students who are on probation, providing a structured educational setting that can support their unique legal and personal development requirements.




Success One! Charter High School provides adults aged 18 and over with educational opportunities tailored to their individual goals, with a focus on strengthening specific subject areas. With campuses in both Orland and Willows, the school offers flexibility and accessibility for adult learners. Prospective students are encouraged to visit either campus to enroll, explore courses, receive help with registration, and learn about the options for obtaining an Equivalency (GED/HiSET) or High School Diploma.

SPECIAL PROGRAMS: EMPOWERING FUTURE PATHWAYS

Career Technical Education (CTE) programs **provide hands-on learning experiences**, equipping students with the skills and knowledge they need to excel in various career fields. GCOE offers CTE programs at multiple high schools and extends opportunities to adults.

Beyond high school, GCOE's **College & Career** resources guide students toward higher education and successful careers. Events like STEM Career Day and Trades Day expose students to diverse options. Additionally, resources on college admissions, financial aid, and scholarships empower students to pursue their aspirations.



The Glenn Adult **Program** offers lifelong educational opportunities and services to the communities of Glenn County and beyond. Its mission is to provide a variety of classes that help adults complete or expand their education, acquire job skills, and foster personal growth. The program includes offerings such as English as a Second Language (ESL), High School Equivalency (GED/HiSET) preparation, and vocational training in fields like medical assisting and audio engineering. Additionally, it VUE® authorized Pearson Testing providing on-site testing for various certification and professional licensure exams.



EDUCATIONAL SERVICES: SUPPORTING DISTRICT EDUCATORS

The 2023-24 year has been a remarkable journey for the Educational Services department at the Glenn County Office of Education as it advanced instructional quality, supported diverse learning needs, and strengthened community engagement across Glenn County. Educational Services focused on fostering cohesive and supportive learning environments while celebrating the incredible achievements of educators, students, and families.

This year, nearly 200 educators across Glenn County completed Project ARISE courses, earning the highest completion rate in the state. Alongside this success, over 50 professional development workshops were delivered online and in-person, empowering teachers, paraprofessionals, and administrators with the best practices in literacy instruction and intervention.

The Antibias Grant work brought antiracism and cultural inclusivity to the forefront. Twenty Glenn County K-5 educators participated in "Using Children's Literature for Antibias Education," facilitated by the California Global Education Project.





The CalHope Social and Emotional Learning (SEL) program touched the lives of over 200 staff members through training in SEL, mindfulness, and wellbeing. Students benefited from new wellness spaces and SEL-focused curricula that brought social and emotional skills into classrooms countywide.

The *EPICC grant continued to transform English Learner (EL) instruction*, engaging over 100 educators with professional development on topics like academic language and newcomer support. Teams of educators embraced leadership roles as Multilingual Learner Trainers, delivering PD to their colleagues and opening their classrooms for observation to share best practices.

In partnership with CSU, Chico, the *Education Career Pathways program supported 17 classified staff* in pursuing their teaching credentials, covering tuition, books, and fees. This year, a fully online apprenticeship program was launched, enabling classroom aides to earn their credentials while staying in their classrooms, seamlessly blending professional growth with day-to-day impact.

EDUCATIONAL SERVICES: FOSTERING COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Through CA Serves, students and educators elevated civic engagement in Glenn County. Highlights included a Family Forum where student civic ambassadors brought together over 100 students and parents to "Meet the City Council." Meanwhile, 35 educators advanced Action Civics integration across disciplines with the UC Berkeley History Project, and both Orland and Willows High Schools celebrated National Voter Education Week with voter registration drives and classroom visits from

local judges.



Welcome!

The *Community Schools initiative expanded its reach* as five local educational agencies used planning grant funds to conduct needs assessments and involve parents, students, and community members in designing whole-child services. These efforts included family engagement workshops, regional site visits, and training that aligned schools with their communities' unique needs.



The Expanded Learning programs flourished, serving 1,219 students across 11 school sites. Expanded learning staff participated in robust

expanded learning staff participated in robust summer training sessions, ensuring high-quality programming for the growing number of students benefiting from after-school opportunities.

These achievements reflect the passion, dedication, and creativity of educators, students, and families. Together, they are redefining what it means to provide inclusive, equitable, and high-quality education in Glenn County.

Glenn County Senior Nutrition's mission is to enable seniors to maintain maximum health, independence, and dignity by providing nutritious and delicious meals, cooked on site and served hot. Lunch is provided Monday through Friday, offering sit down dining locations in both Orland and Willows, as well as delivered meals for individuals who are homebound. In 2024 Glenn County Senior Nutrition delivered 36,352 meals, and served 5,672 congregate meals for a total of 42,024 meals.

HUMAN RESOURCES

For those passionate about education or pursuing a career in a school setting, *GCOE's Human Resources (HR)* department offers support to take the next step.

The HR team *oversees the successful Substitute Consortium*, streamlining the hiring process for substitute teachers across nine districts and charter schools, creating valuable job opportunities within the community. GCOE is proud to *support local districts through quarterly Job-Alike events*, fostering collaboration among school, district, and county office staff. Additionally, GCOE employs the only Credential Analyst in Glenn County, *providing crucial support to credentialed educators* to ensure compliance with credentialing requirements and deadlines, while guiding new educators in submitting documentation to the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing.

BUSINESS SERVICES

The Business Services Department serves as the financial cornerstone of the local education system and as a strategic partner to the school districts. It **provides comprehensive fiscal support to all school districts in Glenn County**, along with the various programs offered by the County Office of Education itself. The dedicated team within the department manages a wide array of financial responsibilities, including **budget development**, **payroll processing**, **grant management**, **and financial reporting**, ensuring that every educational dollar is optimized to benefit students.

The Business Services Department includes services provided through the **Print Shop**, which is open to all school districts, community partners, and the general public and **assisted over 250 unique customers in 2023-2024**.

FACILITIES SERVICES

The Facilities Management Department is **committed to maintaining safe, functional, and welcoming spaces for students, staff, and families**. Through strategic planning, teamwork, and a focus on sustainability and efficiency, the Facilities team continues to enhance the facilities that are essential for the success of Glenn County Office of Education.


