

LAUSD Online Stakeholder Survey Results

Between mid-January and mid-February, 51 members of the public completed an online survey specifically related to the Teaching & Learning Framework. Members of the general public were informed of the LAUSD Stakeholder Survey via the weekly “We Are LAUSD” newsletter and through outreach to our community-based organizations that work directly with external stakeholders. We would like to thank these individuals who read and completed the survey, further contributing to substantive changes to the Teaching & Learning Framework.

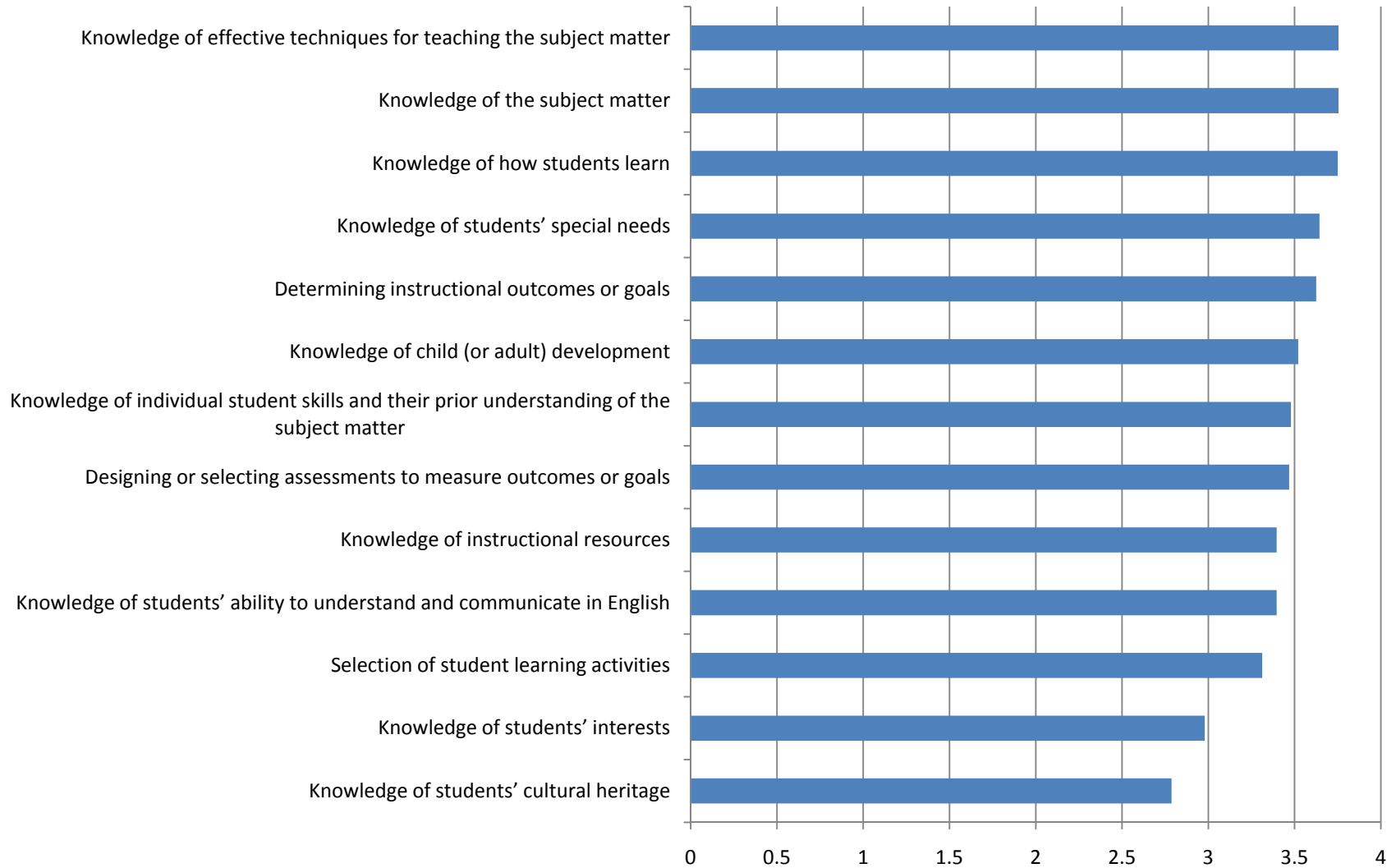
Table1 provides a summary of the survey participants. Just over 35 percent of the respondents to the General Survey were parents or guardians, while just over 30 percent were members of the business community. Additionally, 20 percent of respondents were youth or education-focused nonprofit employees or board members. Almost 14 percent described themselves as community organizers.

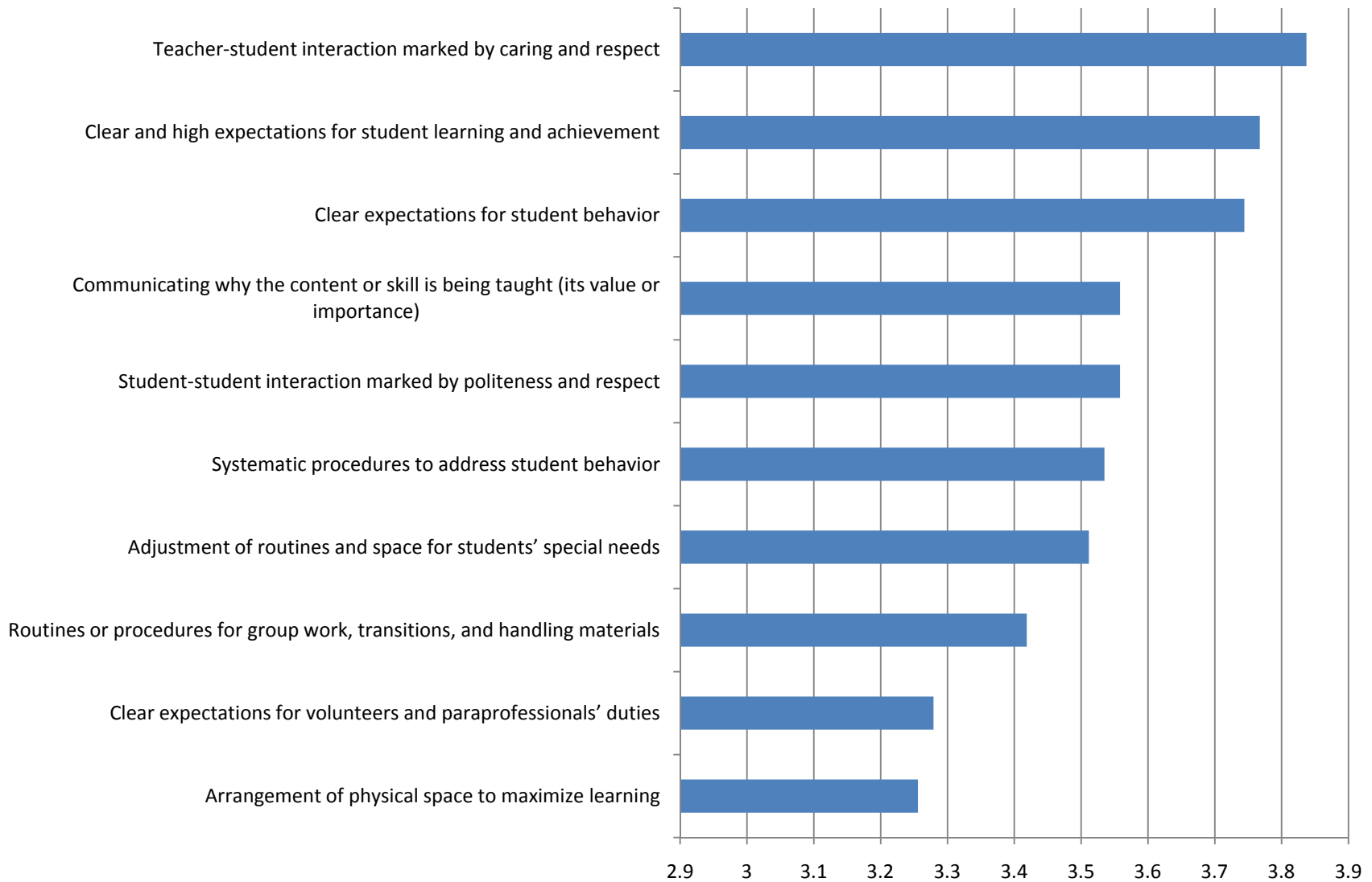

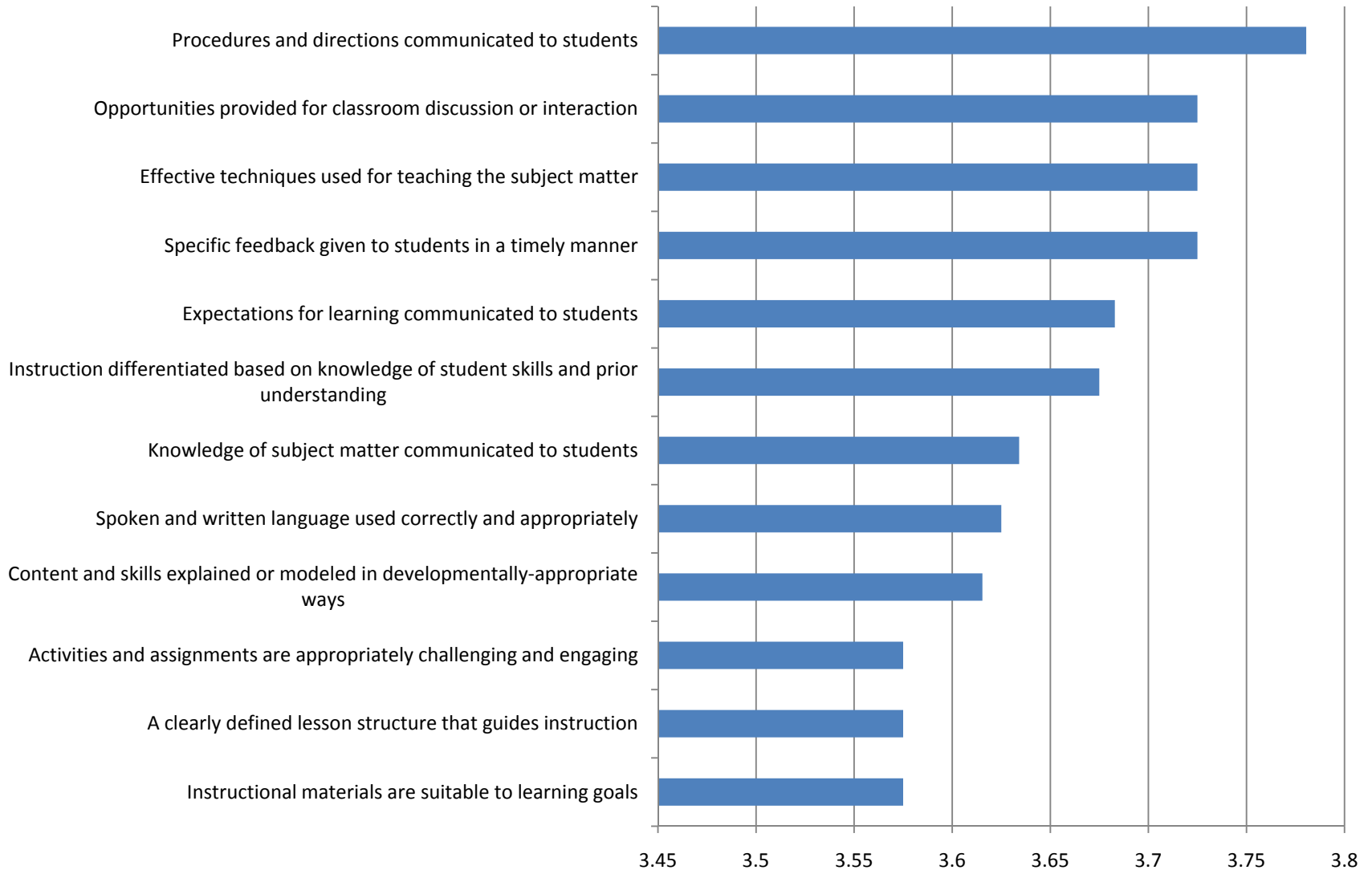
Standard 1: Planning in Priority Order (n=49)



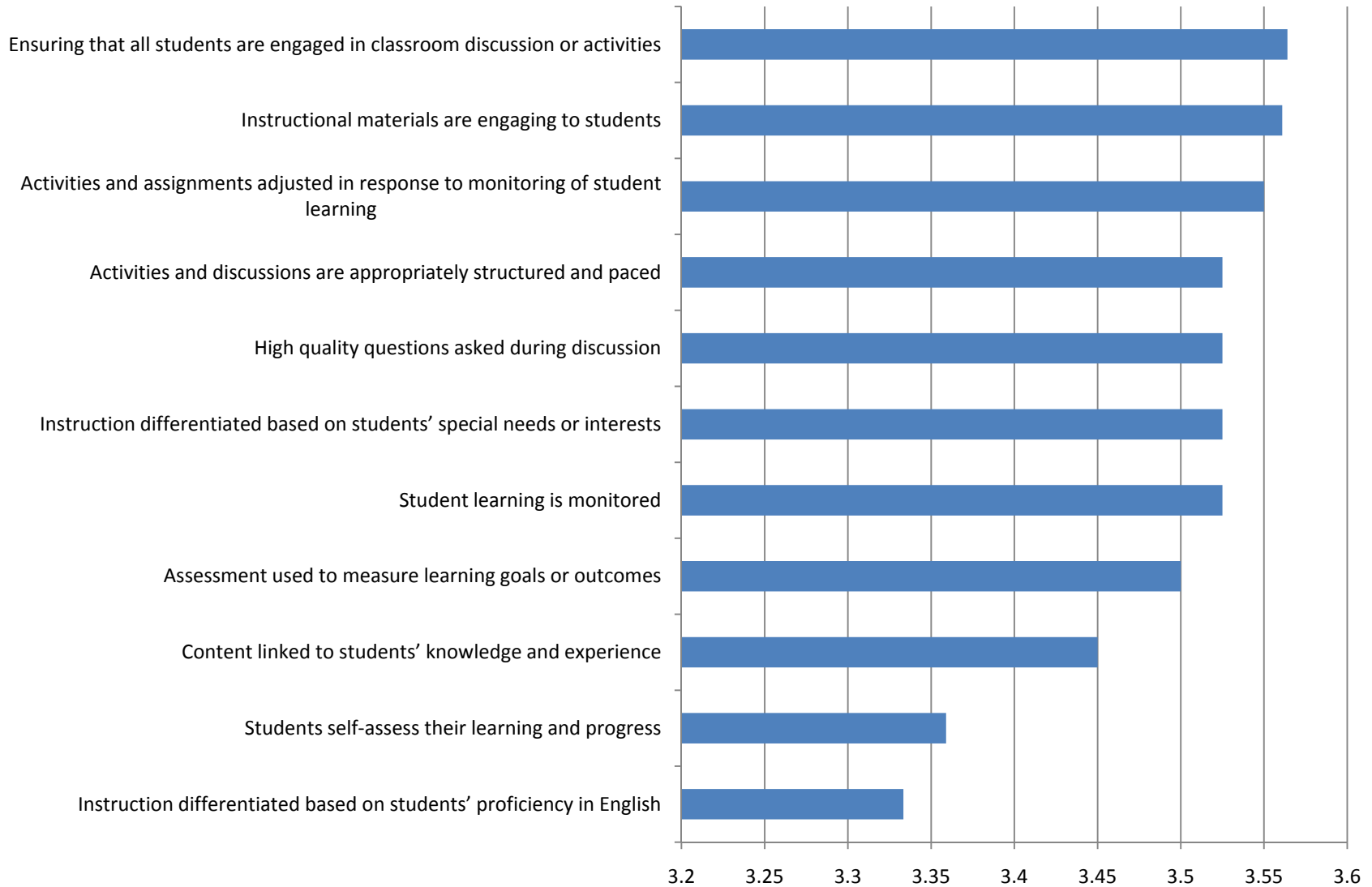
Standard 2: Classroom Environment in Priority Order (n=43)



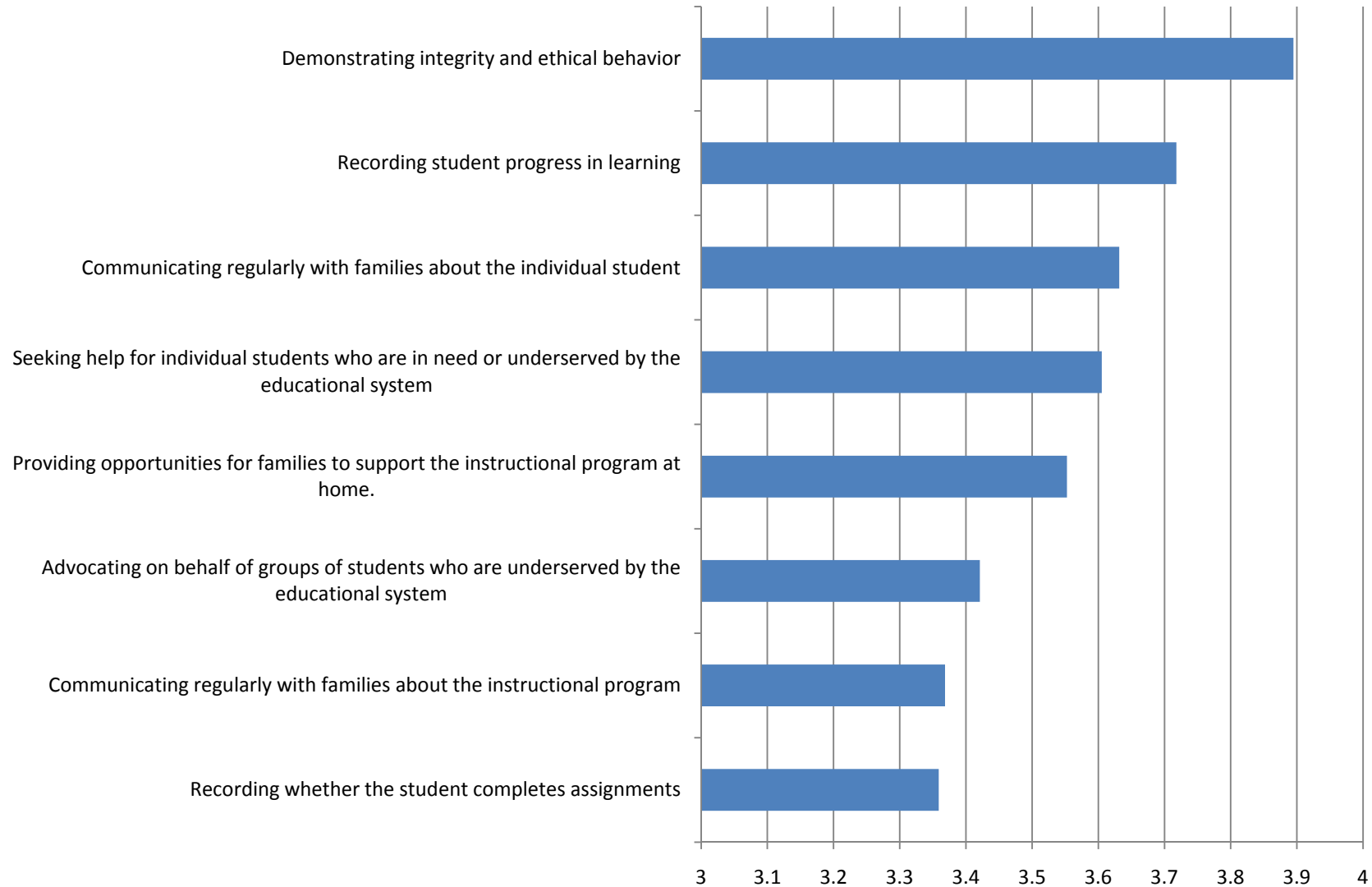
Standard 3: Instruction--Highest Priorities (n=41)
