

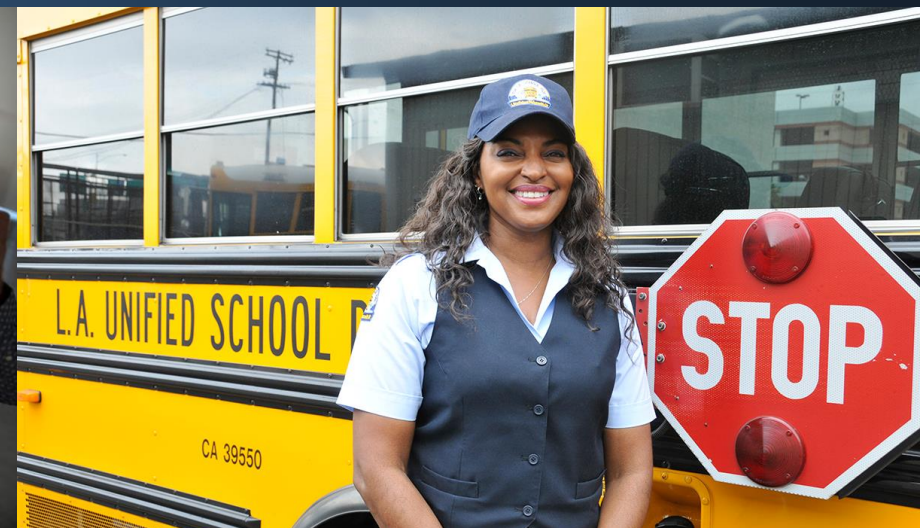

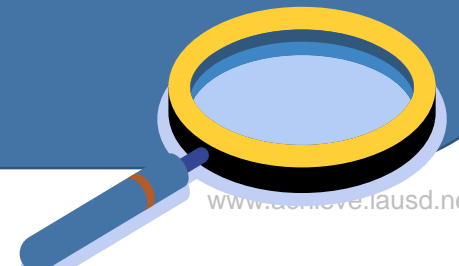

 - licensing and credentialing of professional educators in the State
 - enforcement of professional practices of educators, and the discipline of credential holders in the State of California.

CA Subject Matter Requirement



Via EXAM

- CSET: California Subject Examinations for Teachers
 - Multiple subject (elementary) = Multiple subject CSET I, II & III
 - Single subject math = Math CSET I, II & III
 - Single subject English = English CSET I, II, III & IV

Via COURSEWORK

- Degree in English? English Subject Matter met
- Degree in Math? Math subject matter met
- Degree in Liberal Studies? Multiple Subject (Elementary) subject matter met
- Degree in Philosophy? Might have to take and pass CSET to meet the Subject Matter requirement
- Some universities have CTC-approved subject matter preparation programs that can be completed while earning a Bachelor's Degree

Choosing a Teacher Preparation Pathway



Traditional Pathways

- Complete coursework
- Student teaching
- Earn your credential **BEFORE** becoming a full-time teacher of record with responsibility for the classroom
- May be integrated with Bachelors with some programs



Alternative Pathways

- Complete some foundational training (called pre-service orientation)
- Finish coursework while simultaneously being a full-time teacher
- Typically, more intense
- University Intern
- District Intern



Organizational Excellence

Did you know that classified employees are eligible to receive between \$600 – \$1,100 every fiscal year for taking courses that relate to their District service?

Tuition Reimbursement

- Eligible employees may receive between \$600 – \$1,100 per fiscal year in tuition reimbursement, depending on the amount outlined in the employee's [Bargaining Unit Agreement](#).
- The purpose of the tuition reimbursement program is to support classified employees in increasing their knowledge, understanding, and skills as they relate to their employment and service to our District.

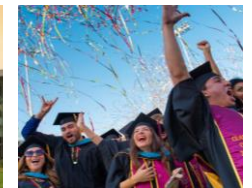
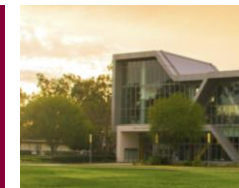


CSUDH – LAUSD Residency Program

- ❖ Earn up to \$15,000 stipend*
- ❖ Progress through the program as a cohort
- ❖ Year-long apprenticeship with mentor teachers
- ❖ Personalized mentoring and advisement
- ❖ Guaranteed enrollment in courses
- ❖ Priority employment with LAUSD
- ❖ May qualify for a TEACH Grant of up to \$4,000

Authorizes instruction of specific subjects (math, science, etc.) typically in grades 6-12



Multiple Subject Teaching Credential

Authorizes instruction of all subjects typically at elementary grade levels



Special Education Teaching Credential

Alliant offers a special education credential in **mild/moderate** disabilities that authorizes instruction in K-12 classrooms

Pathways to Earning your Credential

Standard Internship

✓ You are the **teacher of record** in the classroom.

✓ This is a **paid position** and must be at least a .6 FTE appointment

✓ Internship is completed in a **WASC accredited public or charter school** and further identified Partnerships within the Alliant MOU list

Criteria for internship eligibility:



120 hours of preservice coursework (state mandate). Alliant offers preservice online every 8 weeks



Complete appropriate California Subject Examination for Teachers (CSET)



Valid Offer of Employment from District



Other criteria apply and Alliant's credential analyst team will assist in collecting the additional items for eligibility

Credential Support

- ✓ Candidates are assigned a Credential Analyst who will be there to support them throughout their program
- ✓ At the beginning of their program candidates receive a Welcome Letter with helpful information and resources
- ✓ A Credentialing Orientation is offered within candidate's first term at Alliant
- ✓ A Credential Analyst works with the candidate as they complete the Clinical Practice clearance benchmarks
- ✓ Candidates receive reminder emails throughout their program to ensure they are on track to receive their credential
- ✓ Credential Analysts are always available to help answer any questions via phone or email

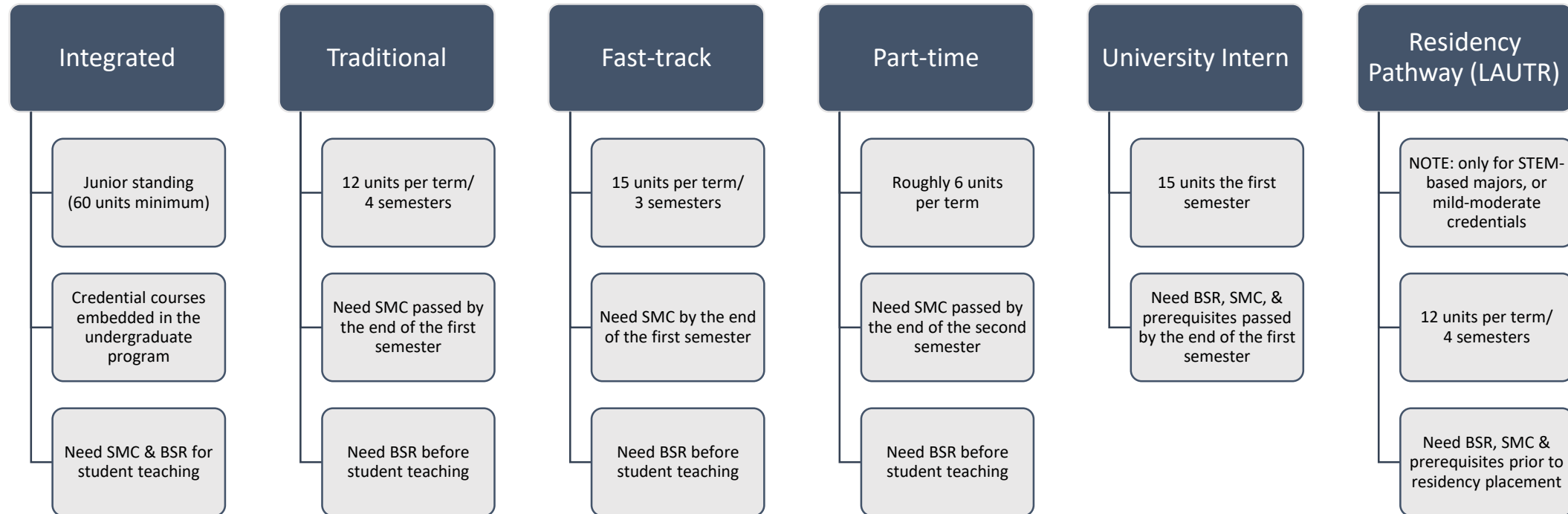

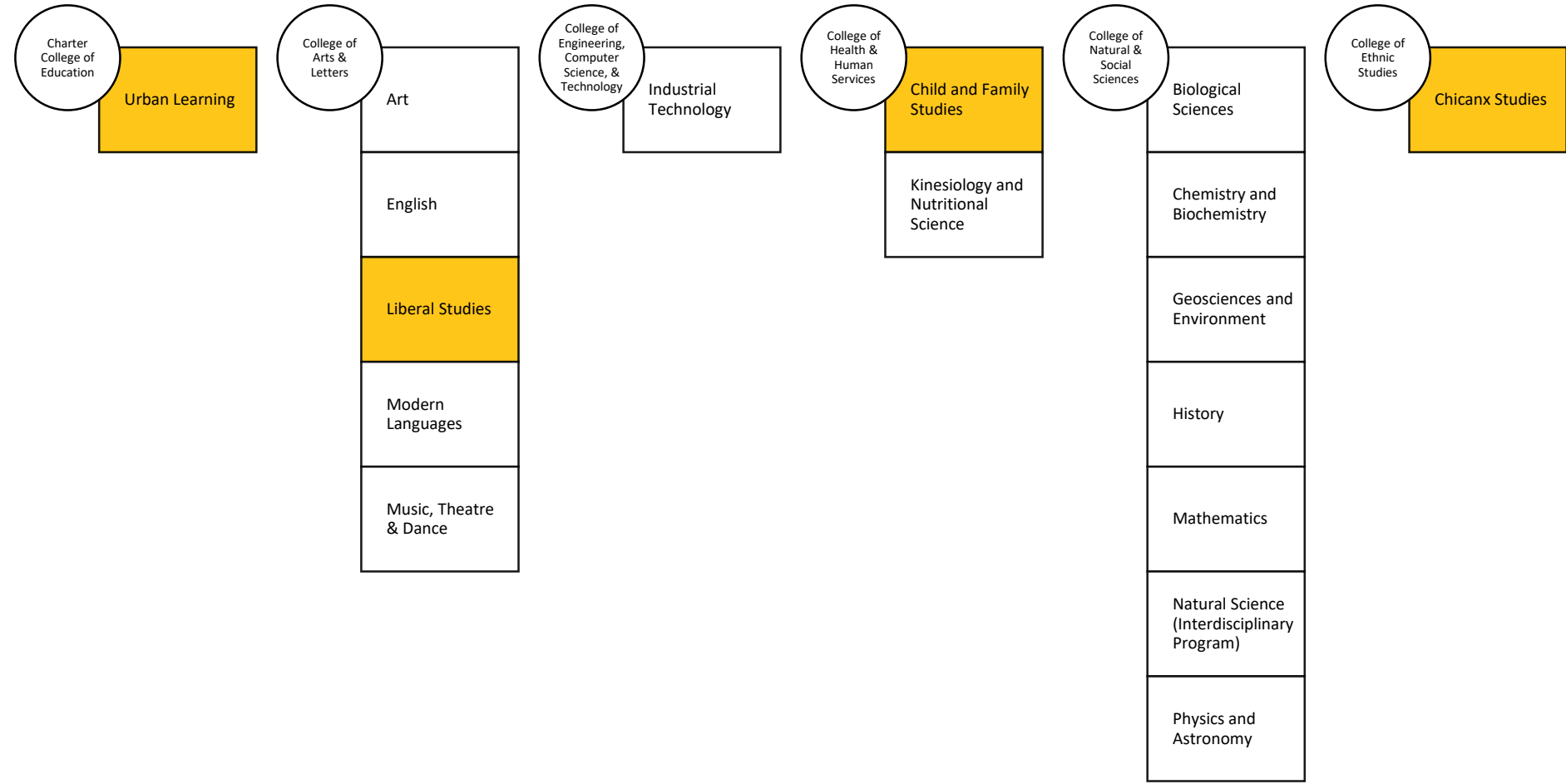

CBEST (BSR)

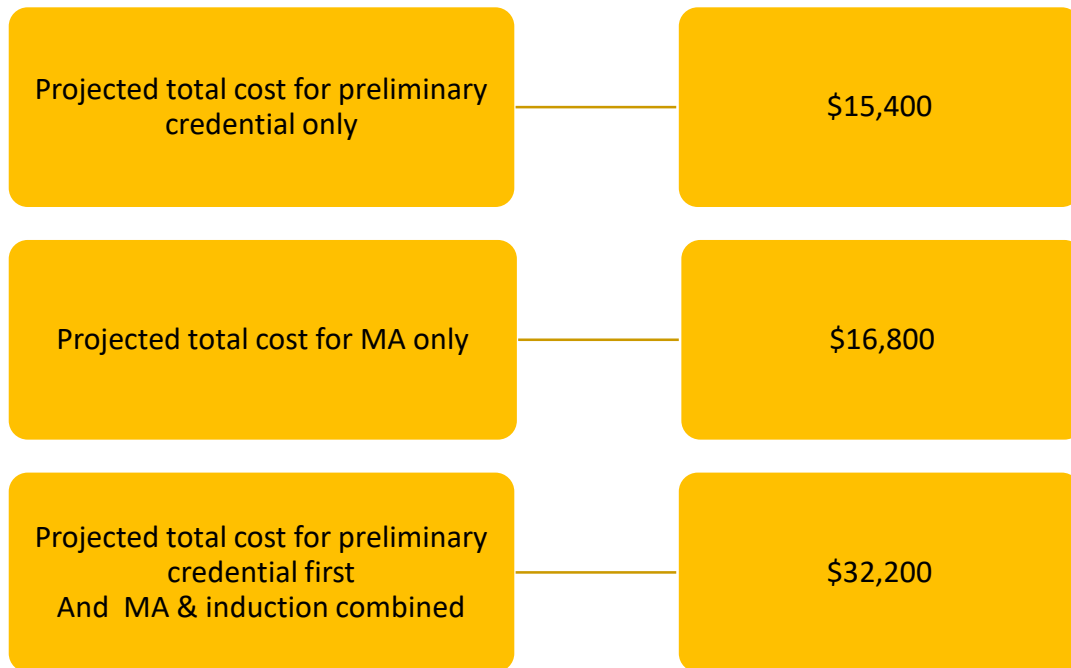
