Who is someone at LC who has made a positive impact on you?

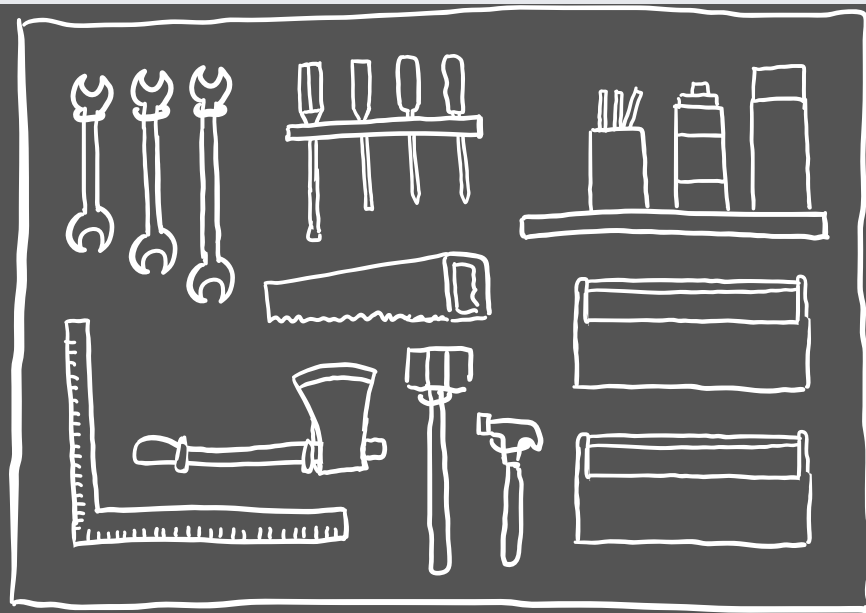
Someone who impacted my life was all my teachers who have helped me succeed in all my classes.

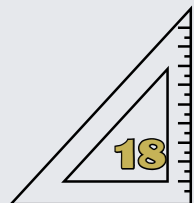
WHAT ARE YOUR GOALS FOR THE AGRICULTURE PROGRAM MOVING FORWARD?
