## New Partnership with The University of Texas at Tyler



ON DECEMBER 8, LEVERETT'S CHAPEL ISD OFFICIALLY SIGNED A NEW PARTNERSHIP WITH THE UNIVERSITY OF TEXAS AT TYLER. THIS AGREEMENT EXPANDED EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES FOR BOTH STUDENTS AND EMPLOYEES IN OUR DISTRICT. IT STRENGTHENED COLLEGE PATHWAYS CONNECTED TO THE DUAL CREDIT AND KILGORE COLLEGE COURSES OUR STUDENTS ALREADY TAKE. IT ALSO PROVIDED DISCOUNTED TUITION OPTIONS FOR LCISD EMPLOYEES WHO WANT TO CONTINUE THEIR EDUCATION.

THROUGH THIS AGREEMENT, UT TYLER OFFERED REDUCED TUITION FOR UNDERGRADUATE DEGREES AND SEVERAL GRADUATE PROGRAMS. ONE KEY OPPORTUNITY INCLUDED A ONE YEAR ONLINE MASTER'S PROGRAM IN EDUCATIONAL LEADERSHIP WITH PRINCIPAL CERTIFICATION AT A DISCOUNTED RATE. EMPLOYEES ALSO RECEIVED TUITION DISCOUNTS FOR GRADUATE PROGRAMS IN SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT, CURRICULUM AND INSTRUCTION, READING EDUCATION, AND SPECIAL EDUCATION.

LEVERETT'S CHAPEL ISD APPRECIATES THE SUPPORT OF JULIE V. PHILLEY, DAVID BARRON, AND THE UT TYLER STAFF WHO HELPED MAKE THIS PARTNERSHIP POSSIBLE. THEIR COMMITMENT TO RURAL SCHOOL DISTRICTS AND ACCESS TO HIGHER EDUCATION CONTINUES TO MAKE A POSITIVE IMPACT.







# 3RD SIX WEEKS


# HIGH SCHOOL THEATRE PERFORMANCE

# Powerlifting Season Off to a Strong Start




IT'S NOT JUST ABOUT ACADEMICS, IT'S ABOUT COMMUNICATION, SELF-ADVOCACY, SOCIAL SKILLS, EMOTIONAL REGULATION, AND DAILY LIVING SKILLS THAT STUDENTS USE EVERY SINGLE DAY. IT'S A SPACE BUILT ON CONSISTENCY AND CELEBRATING PROGRESS IN ALL ITS FORMS.
- FOR STUDENTS AND FAMILIES, THIS WORK IS IMPORTANT BECAUSE IT DIRECTLY IMPACTS STUDENTS' QUALITY OF LIFE. WHEN STUDENTS LEARN HOW TO EXPRESS THEIR NEEDS, NAVIGATE ROUTINES, BUILD RELATIONSHIPS, OR GAIN INDEPENDENCE, THEY GAIN A STRONGER VOICE IN THEIR OWN LIVES. THOSE SKILLS FOLLOW THEM BEYOND THE CLASSROOM INTO THEIR HOMES, COMMUNITIES, AND FUTURES.

WATCHING STUDENTS REALIZE THAT THEIR VOICE MATTERS IS ONE OF THE MOST REWARDING PARTS OF THIS WORK.
