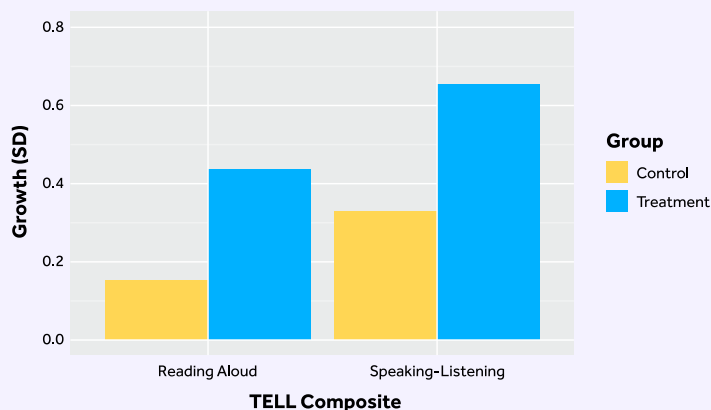
Proven to improve outcomes for English Learners

A randomized controlled trial ([Harper et al., 2021](#)) found that English Learners (ELs) who used Rosetta Stone showed greater gains on the Test of English Language Learning (TELL) relative to peers not using the program.

Specifically, after a year of using Rosetta Stone, ELs in grades 6-8 performed better on the speaking, listening, and reading aloud portions of the TELL. And the more students used Rosetta Stone, the greater their improvements.

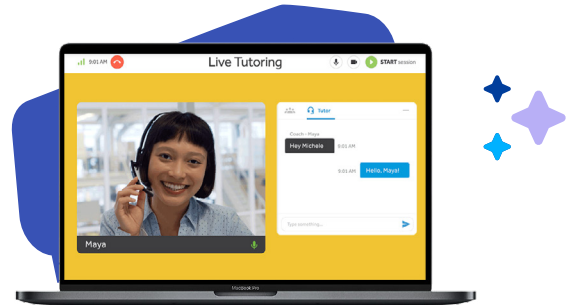
