
IXL is designed to be used daily to reinforce your lessons and help students make academic gains.


Plan your lesson

Pro tip: Pin your skill plans for easy access for you and your students!





Engage students in collaborative learning

Start a Group Jam

To further support whole class or small group instruction, Group Jams provide exciting ways for students to work together on IXL skills! During a Group Jam, your students will see and answer the same IXL question at the same time.

Meaningful independent practice

Set practice goals


For each IXL skill, students should work to a SmartScore of 80, which is considered proficiency. Encourage students to reach a SmartScore of 80 (proficiency) in 2 skills a week.

If a student achieves proficiency and is ready for a challenge, they can always strive for mastery—a SmartScore of 100!



Empower independent learning with instructional resources

Direct your students to IXL’s instructional resources to help support them while working on skills independently. IXL includes audio support, Spanish language support, video tutorials for key math skills, and provides students with immediate feedback after each response with question-specific explanations.

Monitor student progress

Live Classroom
