Roberta Villanueva
Coordinator

Roberta has dedicated 30.6 years of service to LAUSD. Her passion for nursing began in her senior year at Eagle Rock High School when she took a Hospital Occupations class and, with the guidance and support of her teacher, applied to the LAC+USC School of Nursing. As a new graduate, she worked at LAC+USC Medical Center in Labor & Delivery, ICU/CCU, and pediatric clinics as a specialist. Meanwhile, she earned her Bachelor of Science in Nursing at CSULA and was accepted into a Master's program with a Nurse Practitioner emphasis. She was later recruited by a colleague to work in the School-Based Clinics at LAUSD.

In 1995, she joined LAUSD as a School Nurse at Salvin Special Education Center while obtaining her School Nurse Credential. She then worked as a Nurse Practitioner in the Child Health and Disability Prevention (CHDP) program, serving as a traveling NP providing vaccines and physical exams to school-age children. Five years later, she launched an Asthma Prevention Program in partnership with the USC Breath Mobile, which led to significant improvements in children's asthma management and reduced school absenteeism. She later served as an Organizational Facilitator in the North Region, collaborating with school teams on crisis intervention and providing MOUs for mental health, vision, dental, and medical providers across LAUSD. She also partnered with the LA Trust to establish a preventative Dental Program in the district, bringing dental providers to Wellness Centers to perform screenings, fluoride varnish treatments, and referrals for more serious dental conditions.

During this time, she earned a Master of Arts in Education with an administrative credential and went on to serve as a Nursing Coordinator before transferring to Student Medical Services as a Coordinator. In her current role, she manages SEPA LA and SEPA Panorama while supporting the daily operations of 15 School-Based Clinics alongside the senior physician. Roberta takes great pride in her accomplishments, the meaningful relationships she has built. She remains motivated by the ever-evolving nature of medicine, the potential of AI to transform healthcare, and her strong commitment to preventative care. As she transitions into retirement this June, she looks forward to traveling—especially visiting all 63 U.S. National Parks—spending time with family, enjoying concerts, exercising, and exploring new interests through PCC Consortium classes.
