Theatre Helps Us Understand the World Around Us

How can theatre help us to understand our world?

Developmental Stage

Students in grade three are developing greater control of their fine motor skills. They can separate movement hemispheres (left/right, cross axis movement). They are curious and love to learn. They can sort and organize objects and ideas, lead and follow directions. They can follow rules in a group.

In their emotional development, these children love to please. It is an age where they still feel an omnipotence, a sense of being the center of their universe, and they have a sense of urgency about their needs. They are emotionally expressive and recognize the cause and effect in their interactions. In other words, they have a growing sense of agency or empowerment. They begin to be able to critique their own artwork and that of others.

Practices we use in drama activities:

- Resolving conflict through improvisation
- Showing cause and effect through improvisation
- Identifying universal characters and themes in stories
- Portraving a variety of characters
- Critiquing one's own work as well as that of others
- Expressing a variety of emotions
- · Demonstrating ability to project voice
- Developing the ability to work independently in cooperative groups
