Enduring Understanding

- Student displays a reflection on the success of their criteria.
- 2 Student attempts to express what they communicated in their artwork. Student attempts to develop some criteria and may share or not. Student displays a developing reflection on the success of their criteria.
- 1 Student is not able to express what they communicated in their artwork. Student does not develop any criteria. Student does not display any reflection on any criteria.
