Academic Supports for C or Better

Just-in-Time Intervention

Academic Course Extension (ACE)

Credit Recovery

Personalized intervention supports for students with gaps in proficiency on learning targets or standards.
In-class materials and resources provide opportunities for deliberate practice to complete learning.

For students needing to improve a low final end-of-course grade. ACE provides extended time, practice, assignments and assessments for students to earn a C or better. New grade replaces the prior grade on transcript.

For students who were not successful in passing a required A-G course on the first attempt.

Multiple course types & schedule options provide the best-fit for students to recover the course.

New grade will be added to transcript



Q: Were you required to do any of the following for a class assignment, senior project, or class grade?"


