## **Fiscal Health**

**Consolidated "negative" is misleading** — it's driven by early-year non-cash items (depreciation, accrued interest, amortization) in the LLC, a separate entity, not operating losses at Charter School.

**Standard structure statewide** — a nonprofit school with a single-member LLC holding title is a common, legal, and recognized model for charter facilities in California.

**No profits, no private benefit** — the LLC has no private owners and makes no distributions; governance and related-party disclosures are transparent.

**Lease = bond payments** — the school's lease is set to cover debt service and required reserves, with no guaranty by Charter School beyond the lease.

**District Fiscal Operations Rubric** states that if "Net assets are positive in the most current annual independent audit report," the Charter School should receive a score of 4. The LLC is a separate entity and does not run the school - why its assets were included in our latest oversight rating is still unclear to us.



VIPHS is Fiscally Sound and demonstrates responsible financial governance by positive latest independent audit report, and by shielding the school from building-and-bond-related liability through its commonly recognized structure.

## **English Learner Achievement**

ICMS English Learners outperform neighboring schools:

- ELA DFS: -114.7 vs. Canoga Park (-127.4) and Sutter (-123.0)
- Math DFS: -147.6 vs. Canoga Park (-182.0) and Sutter (-150.2)

Despite higher proportions of ELs and low-income students, ICMS shows greater growth.



## **Performance Comparison**

- **❖** ELA (All Students 2023–24):
  - ICMS: -79.4
  - Canoga Park: -77.7
  - Sutter: -74.8
  - → Performing nearly the same as district schools serving lower-needs populations.
- **❖** Math (All Students 2023–24):
  - ICMS: -120.1
  - Canoga Park: -128.7
  - Sutter: -106.4
  - → ICMS remains competitive despite higher barriers.



## **Addressing Misconceptions**

- Our population faces challenges others do not.
- EL and Low SES populations far exceed those at Sutter and Canoga Park.
- Ernest Lawrence Middle School is a gifted magnet that selects students.

ICMS focuses on inclusion, not selection.






## **Enrollment Growth**

# Verified Data & Participation Rates

- ICMS' verified **NWEA MAP Growth** data provide *clear and convincing* evidence of academic progress.
- The claim that ICMS failed to meet the **95% participation rate** is based on a **misinterpretation of NWEA** "**growth event**" **terminology** and use of incorrect enrollment baselines.
- When calculated correctly, ICMS meets the 95% participation threshold in Math and achieves 94% in ELA, with the shortfall due only to language-access barriers and students on alternative curriculum beyond the school's control.

Despite these challenges, verified data confirm that ICMS students achieved one year or more of academic growth across nearly all grades and subgroups in both ELA and Math over the last two years.


