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Programs By Type ETK-8th Grade

Instructional Support

Grades ETK-8 students will be offered in person programs designed to support core instruction, Arts and Science Day Camp as well as targeted academic intervention in a small group setting.

Extended Learning

Beyond the Bell will offer in person programs to students in Grades ETK-6. Programs include Creative Brain Learning, Kids 4 College, LA's Best, Woodcraft Rangers and Youth Development Program. We continue to grow our partners.

Specialized Programs

Students eligible for specialized programs will be contacted by their school. These programs include CA State Preschool Program, Extended School Year (ESY), Newcomer Enrichment Summer Program and Migrant Ed Program (MEP).

Summer Term

This program offers credit recovery courses and opportunities to accelerate progress toward high school graduation.

Specialized Programs

Students eligible for specialized programs will be contacted by their school. These programs include Extended School Year (ESY), Newcomer Enrichment Summer Program and Migrant Ed Program (MEP).

Virtual Enrichment

From learning how to play the bass, guitar or ukulele with Fender Play to Cartooning and Animation with Illumination, to learning new cultures through World Language courses

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- Transportation will be provided to increase student participation
- Student transportation will be provided for students who reside outside a 1-mile radius of their assigned summer school site
- Additional transportation will be made available upon request
- Families will opt-in for transportation services

High School Programs–Paid Internships



- **LA City funding supports the Student-to-Student Program** (supports 274 students)
- **City, County, and ESSER funding supports 320 students** with paid internships at the following locations
 - 6 Early Education Centers
 - 46 elementary schools in partnership with Beyond the Bell
 - 4 Team Heal Programs
 - 5 LAUSD Divisions (Architecture and Engineering, Civic Center, Early Childhood Education Department, Facilities, and Student Health and Human Services)
 - Other placements (USC Norris Medical Library, Orthopaedic Institute for Children, SoLA Tech Center, LA's Best Office, MCLC Event Planning, Bernstein HS – Athletic Film Production, and Venice HS/West Coast Sports Medicine)
