### **Nondiscrimination Law**



- All students deserve and need a safe and supportive learning environment
- California is a Safe Place to Learn Act (<u>Education Code Section 234 -234.5</u>) all persons regardless of protected categories have equal rights and opportunities in schools
- LA Unified is committed to a learning environment free from discrimination, harassment, intimidation, abusive conduct, or bullying
- Non-discrimination Policy describes the protected categories and complaint process
- <u>Complaint process</u> if there are any complaints of discrimination, harassment, intimidation, abusive conduct, or bullying, a process has been developed to receive and review the complaints. 5 C.C.R. Section 5600 *et seq*.

## **CA Attorney General Guidance**



- Right to a Free Public Education: All children have a right to equal access to free public education, regardless of their or their parents'/guardians' immigration status
- Information Required for School Enrollment: Variety of documents accepted to demonstrate proof of child's age or residency; schools not required to keep a copy of document used as proof of a child's age
- Confidentiality of Personal Information: Federal and state laws protect student education records and personal information



## **Sharing Student and Family Information**



- Districts are prohibited from collecting citizenship or immigration status information
- Restrictions on Release of Personal Information or Educational Records
  - Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA):
     Written consent is needed before disclosure of information
  - California Education Code includes overlapping and additional protections against the disclosure of students' educational records

## Responding to Hate Crimes and Bullying Related to National Origin or Ethnicity

- District's non-discrimination policy
  - Prohibits discrimination, harassment, intimidation, and bullying based on a student's actual or perceived characteristics, including nationality, ethnicity, or immigration status
  - Posted on website in multiple locations including the <u>We Are One webpage</u>
- LAUSD Office of Student Civil Rights handles receiving and investigating complaints based on immigration status among other protected categories

- Beware of "notary publics" who represent themselves as attorneys
