Staff and Student Safety

- Custodial personnel conduct daily campus checks at start and end of school day
- Ensure that all building doors and gates are locked every night
- Arm and disarm intrusion alarm daily
- Lock all gates and exterior doors during school hours

Los Angeles Schools Anonymous Reporting

DESCRIPTION

Los Angeles Schools Anonymous Reporting application, or **LASAR**, aims to increase community focused public safety in and around our schools.

It's a free mobile application for students, families and community members to anonymously report **non-emergency** public safety incidents. It provides a direct communication line to the LASPD.

BENEFIT

Upon receiving the information, the LASPD Watch Commander will triage the reported incident and determine the necessary resource to dispatch. The objective is to reduce incident frequency by proactively responding to behaviors that lead to avoidable acts of violence.

CORE FEATURES

- Easy to use
- Real-time incident reporting to LASPD
- Able to capture photo and/or video of incident
- Geolocation detected by application
- Configurable incident types

School & Community Safety

Emergency Alert

DESCRIPTION

Mobile application for school safety specifically for school staff to alert LASPD of an active assailant situation.

BENEFIT

In real-time, LASPD and school site administrator are alerted of an emergency situation at a school.

The application is designed only to work within District school boundaries.

CORE FEATURES

- Automatically detects the school location of the user
- Option available for user to enter simple texts of the situation
- User simply presses and holds the button for 3 seconds to send the Emergency Alert

Homeless Encampments

Los Angeles Municipal Code 41.18 became effective on September 18, 2022



To keep individuals safe and the public right-of-way accessible, Section 41.18(e) of the LA Municipal Code prohibits individuals from sitting, lying, or sleeping, or storing, using, maintaining, or placing personal property within 500 feet of a School or Day Care Center on or after September 18, 2022

The measure was approved on July 27, on a 11-3 vote, with Mike Bonin (Council District 11), Nithya Raman (Council District 4), and Marquee Harris-Dawson(Council District 8) voting no.

Efforts to Mitigate Homeless Encampments Near Schools






- Weekly meetings with Mayor's Office and select council members
- Communication with LAPD, Transportation and Sanitation
- Operations Coordinators monthly drive around school sites and document encampments and RV within 500 ft
- Information gathered by operations coordinators is collected in a data base and shared with the District's Office of **Government Relations**
- Schools generate 311 calls
- Signs provided by city to all schools (in progress)

Discipline Foundation Policy



- Establish a consistent multi-tiered framework for all schools
- Develop and/or refine a discipline plan that promotes a culture of discipline conducive to learning.

Los Angeles School Police Department

Improving campus safety and creating safe school passages for students, staff, and the school community.

- All school and District-related criminal activity and incidents, except homicide, child abuse, complex sexual assaults, forensics, serial crimes, and selected major crimes.
- > Students and staff experiencing mental health crisis
- > School traffic safety, parking enforcement, and District facilities protection
- > LASPD will defer incidents that occur during non-operational hours to local agency.

Local, State, Federal Law Enforcement & Emergency Services

- > The LASPD shares jurisdiction and interacts with 13 municipal and county law enforcement agencies, as well as state and federal law enforcement and emergency services.
- > The municipal agencies such as LAPD has jurisdictional oversight on all crimes and incidents that occur within their city limits, including those that occur on school property.
- The 13 municipal and county law enforcement agencies work closely with the LASPD to ensure that schools within the city are safe and secure.



Active Shooter Training



- ➤ Summer 2022 101 LASPD members participated in Active Shooter Training
- ➤ July 1, 2022 Year to date, LASPD hosted 215
 Active Shooter presentations with participation
 from 6,115 staff members District wide. Twentysix (26) presentations are currently calendared
- ➤ Spring 2023 LASPD members will be participating in Active Shooter Training April 4, 5, and 6, 2023.
