### Charter School Renewals 2025-2026

- 72 total charter school renewals expected in 2025-2026:
   63 independent charter renewals; 9 affiliated charter renewals

### Charter Renewal Criteria – Brief Overview

Criterion 1	Sound educational program		
	Reasonably comprehensive descriptions of the 15 elements of the petition, and affirmations		
	Not Demonstrably (un)likely to successfully implement the program		
Criterion 2	Charter school performance levels: High, Middle or Low		
	Attained measurable increases in academic achievement (one year's progress) - [Verified Data – Middle]-until January 1, 2026		
	Strong postsecondary outcomes (if applicable) - [Verified Data - Middle]-until January 1, 2026		
Criterion 3	Nondiscriminatory enrollment or dismissal practices		
	Substantial fiscal or governance factors		



### Middle Performing Schools

- Charter schools that do not meet criteria for High or Low are classified as Middle Performing
- > Consideration for a five-year renewal term or denial based on the following:
  - 1) Schoolwide and student group performance on the state and local indicators on the California School Dashboard; and
  - 2) LAUSD Board shall provide greater weight to the measurements of academic performance on the California School Dashboard; and
  - 3) Until **January 1, 2026**, the LAUSD Board shall also consider clear and convincing evidence, demonstrated by verified data, showing either of the following:
    - a. School achieved measurable increases in academic achievement as defined by at least one year's progress for each year in school; OR
    - b. Strong postsecondary outcomes equal to similar peers.



### Middle Performing Schools

- May deny ONLY upon making written findings that:
  - 1) The charter school has failed to meet or make sufficient progress toward meeting standards that provide a benefit to pupils of the school; AND
  - 2) The closure of the charter school is in the best interest of the pupils; AND
  - 3) The decision provided greater weight to the performance on the measurements of academic performance.
    - a. "When determining whether to deny a renewal petition under 1 or 2 above, LAUSD will consider the full oversight record of the charter school, providing greater weight on the measurements of academic performance. This consideration will include a comparison to Resident Schools' performance on the measurements of academic performance (e.g., reclassification rates, Long-term English Learner (LTEL) rates, and percentage of students Met or Exceeded standards as measured by California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress (CAASPP)..."



### Resident Schools Median Updates

> Resident Schools Median (RSM) is the median data point for resident schools' academic performance:

List of resident schools is generated based on students' addresses

- 2024-2025 Practice: RSM provided publicly 15 calendar days prior to Board action (when used)
- 2025-2026 Practice: List of resident schools will be included in Board materials (when used)

List of schools will be provided to the petitioners 7-10 days prior to the 15-day posting (when used)



## Resident Schools Median Updates (continued)

- > Span Grades (e.g., a school that serves K-12, K-8, 6-12, etc.)
  The list of resident schools is comprised of schools that serve the same grades as the charter school.
- 2024-2025 Practice: When a CAASPP Met or Exceeded comparison was conducted, the schoolwide median was used.
- 2025-2026 Practice: When conducting a CAASPP Met and Exceeded comparison, data will only include the specific grade levels served by the charter school.



### Resident Schools Median Updates (continued)

- Magnet Program Comparison:
  Magnet program data is embedded within schoolwide data outcomes
- 2024-2025 Practice: District schools that had an academic criteria magnet program were included in resident schools list.
- 2025-2026 Practice: The percentage of students in the Gifted/Highly Gifted magnet program will be identified and reported.

Whole school academic admissions criteria magnets are not included on Resident Schools Median Lists.



### **Additional Data Consideration**

- CORE growth model data was **not** adopted by the CA State Board as verified data, but may be used to supplement Dashboard results, upon mutual agreement between the chartering authority (District) and the charter school.
- 2024-2025 Practice: CORE data was not used as a supplement to renewal analysis (no charter school submitted).
- 2025-2026 Practice: Upon mutual agreement between the District and the Charter, CORE will be considered supplemental data.



### **Reclassification Data**

- > Reclassification data has not been published by the State for three consecutive years
- > 2024-2025 Practice:

Reclassification data was not publicly available. English Learner data was assessed using other metrics.

> 2025-2026 Practice:

Reclassification will only be used if published by the State. The District will continue to assess English Learner performance using other metrics.

### High Performing Term-Length Considerations

Charter schools not meeting these considerations will be recommended for a five-year term
