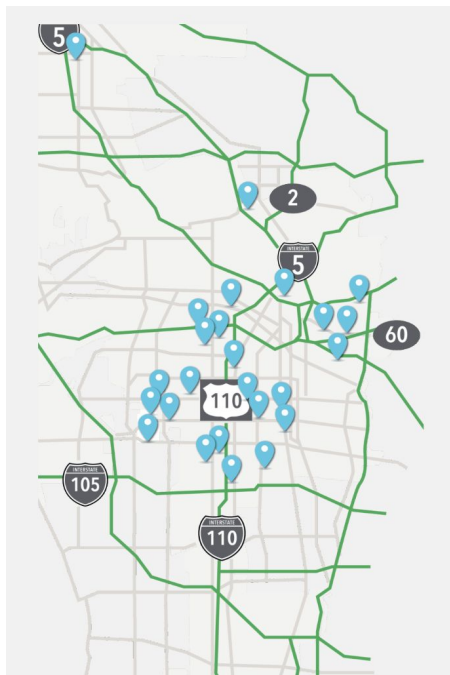

What Community Schools Team Have Accomplished So Far

- We have created/expanded several partnerships since December 2025
- Organized 5 large network donation distributions to all 25 of our schools:
 - Season of Giving w/ **IBTU** (Wellness & Hygiene Products)-\$2 Million
 - A Cup of Joy w/ **IBTU** (Happy Coffee)-\$10K
 - Double the Impact w/ **Convoy of Hope + Baby2Baby** (Food, Diapers/Wipes, and Shoes)-\$100K
 - Mother's Day Giveaway - **Baby2Baby** (Diapers/wipes, maternity clothes, toys, hygiene products)-\$5K
 - Passion Planners and Sticker Books-\$50K

Our Work Moving Forward

Our work will continue to center on supporting the **whole child** in order to drive stronger academic outcomes. Key priority areas include:

- **No Place For Hate (NPFH):** Strengthening school culture, belonging, and inclusive environments for all scholars
- **Chronic Absenteeism:** Support with implementing targeted, data-driven strategies to improve attendance, including partnerships like KnowleJ
- **Parent & Family Engagement:** Deepening authentic family involvement, including **immigration (ICE) support and resources** for our communities

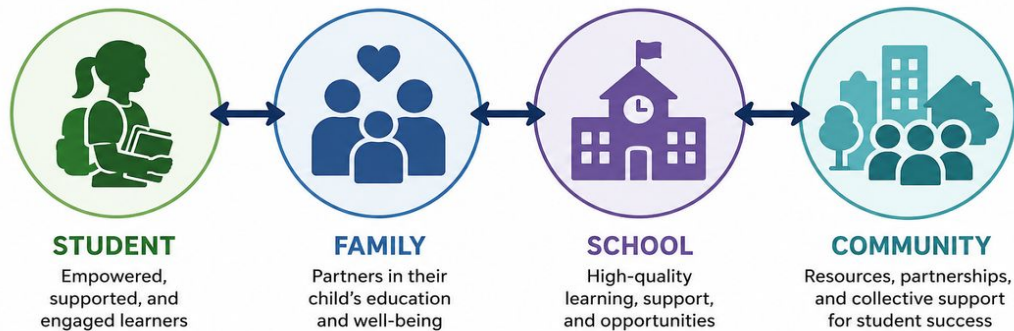


Demographic Summary

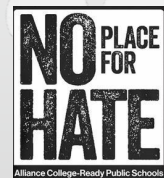

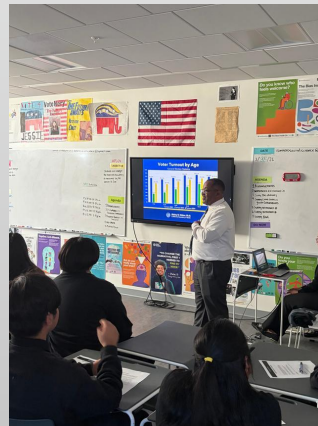
