## STUDENT C - STUDENT INTERVIEW

Interview Date: 3/8/24

### **What do you enjoy about school?**

What makes me come to school is that you can get the education you need, if you want to do a job you have to have education. If I want to be a cashier I learn to take money, if I want to be a librarian I have to learn to read. I also decided I wanted to come to a public school rather than home school.

### **Did you go on any field trips this year? How were they helpful in your learning?**

No this year but last year we went on a lot of field trips. We went to the Natural History Museum. It helped me to learn history, the past, what people did in the past.

### **Did you receive any tutoring this year and how was it helpful? What is most helpful to you in the classroom?**

We do small groups in reading math and anything we need to do to partner up like writing. Yesterday we did a small group doing multiplication on a number line. We have 3 people, one person would write, one would draw, and one would solve the problem. For reading, each student reads a line when we partner up.

### **What programs or services at your school are helpful to you?**

Writing, because I am good at Math and Reading. One program I am in is LA's Best, you can get your homework done before you get home. We have STEM after school. It helps us to learn Science. We also have music – right now I am playing the violin. It is calming and restful.

### **What could we have done better? What could we have done more of to help you succeed?**

I don't think so – we don't need anything. We just need to have a notebook and do 2 problems a day.

### **What would you tell a new student who comes to your school? What advice or guidance would you give them?**
