Summative ELPAC Highlights

Outpacing the State and Other Districts

- LAUSD has a higher percentage of students performing at Level 4 (20.64%)
 than other large districts or statewide average of 15.53%.
- Over 4x the rate of improvement compared to statewide average (4.33 percentage point gain from last year, vs. statewide improvement of 0.9 percentage points)

<u>Unprecedented Achievement</u>

- Highest-ever achievement in history of ELPAC assessment
- All student groups performing better than prior year and pre-pandemic (except for ELs enrolled in schools less than 12 months)

<u>Decrease in Long-Term English Learners (LTEL)</u>

• LAUSD continues to reduce LTELs, down to a low of 9.4% of all ELs



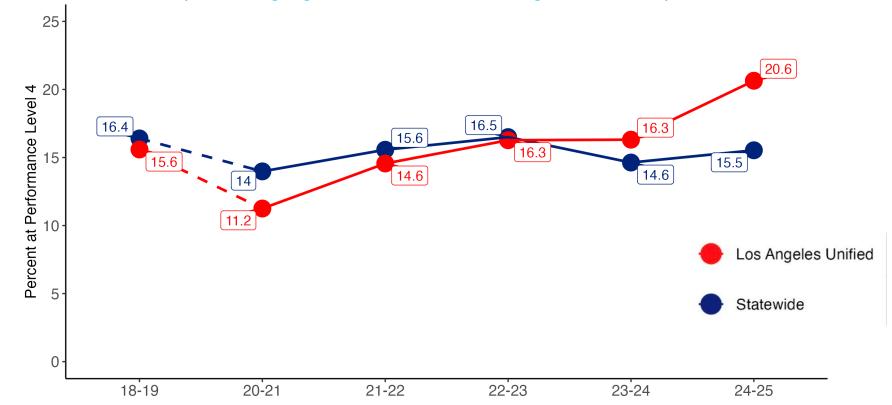

Receptive and Expressive Skills



The English Language Proficiency Assessments for California (ELPAC)measures growth in both Receptive Skills (listening and reading) and Expressive Skills (speaking and writing) in English.



Listening

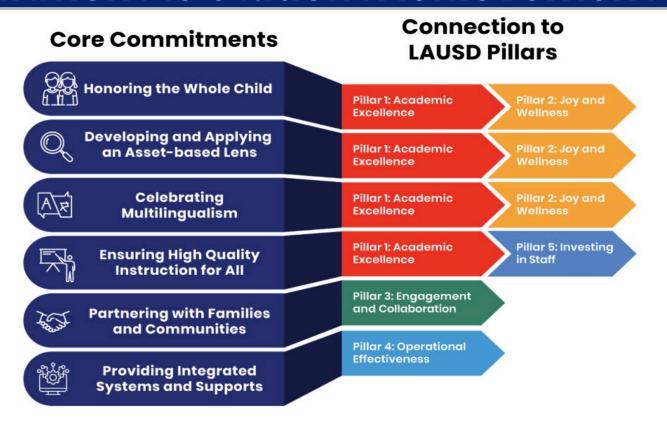
