



What is the Title VI Indian Education Program?

Multilingual Multicultural Education Department (MMED) administers the district's Title VI Indian Education Program, a federally funded initiative designed to meet the unique cultural, linguistic, and academic needs of American Indian and Alaska Native students and families through specialized services and resources.



Who Qualifies?

Any student who self-identifies as American Indian and completes the **ED 506 Indian Student Eligibility Certification Form**, meeting the federal definition of "American Indian." This includes students with membership, descent, or affiliation with a federally recognized tribe, including those of Alaska Native or Eskimo heritage

- Enhance family and community involvement
- Support students who are at risk
