Slide # 2 (2 minutes)

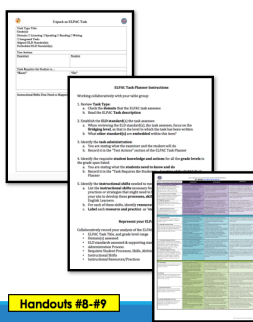

Slide # 3 (7 minutes)

2 minutes--Take participants through the completed template by clicking animation and reading each section.

5 minutes--Distribute large tasks. Have participants plan.

Note: Embedded standards are ELD standard(s) needed to perform task which have not been called out in a task type. For example, Summarize an Academic Task requires a student to listen actively (Part I B 5), although only Part I C 9-Presenting is referred to. An ELPAC task may or may not have embedded standards.

Slide # 4 (30 minutes)

Remind participants that their chart will look like a completed Unpack the ELPAC template, only large. This is everything in the template, just called out.

Participants create their posters. Check in with group and timekeepers at 15 and 5 minute mark.

Session Summary

Slide # 5 (15 minutes)

Gallery walk option A: At end of time creating poster, have group stand in front of their poster, do fickle finger of fate to select spokesperson (everyone puts their finger in the air, at the count of 3, point to who you want to present for your group, the person with the most people pointing at them shares, or chooses someone else to share). and have groups assign timekeeper, move clockwise each minute or so. Check in with groups for first few rotations to ensure that time is monitored.

Option B (little time for gallery walk): Groups stand in front of their poster to begin a self-guided tour moving clockwise. They may return to their seats when done.

Slide # 6 (4 minutes)

Read slide. Give participants time to write. Ask 1-2 participants to share their next steps. Consider participants feedback in implementing follow-up professional development.
