Dear PAC Members



Moving on to other matters that I think are important, I would like to show some slices of the report that was presented to the Board of Education on April 2nd, which shows some data in a more or less understandable way, which are the following, and I will give you a brief explanation.


2022-26 Strategic Plan District Goals In order to build a strong foundation for literacy, move third-grade students, on average, 30 +30pts Literacy points closer to proficiency on Smarter Balanced Assessment English Language Arts/Literacy from 2022 to 2026. In order to improve Algebra I pass rates, move students, on average, 40 points closer to Numeracy +40pts proficiency on Smarter Balanced Assessment Mathematics from 2022 to 2026 in Grades 3-5 and 6-8. The percentage of students in a graduating 9°-12° grade cohort demonstrating college and career readiness with a "C" or better on University of California/California State University 70% **Postsecondary** A-G approved courses will increase to 70% by June 2026. Literacy: 3rd Grade ELA SBA Scores





District Progress 2022-2024

- The District has made progress on all District goals and for most target student groups
 - 6-percentage-point increase in A-G completion
 - 8-point increase in 3rd grade ELA DFS
 - 14- and 9-point increases in 3rd-5th and 6th-8th grade math DFS, respectively
- However, not all schools are making progress
 - 17%-41% of schools did not improve on the District goal metrics 2022-2024
- Meeting the District goals would require a dramatic increase in improvement during the remainder of this school year, and during the 2025-2026 school year

Our duty as the PAC committee is to know how to analyze the data. How? The presenters should offer us understandable training and education, something that has not been achieved so far due to a lack of political will, but this office of parent engagement aims to confuse, divide and censor us.
