- Selection of CAC Members to Participate in Legislative Sharing Day: CAC members who are interested in joining the delegation for Legislative Sharing Day on April 30, 2025, with the Division of Special Education can submit their interest by completing the interest form. Priority will be given to CAC members who have not attended Legislative Sharing Day in the past three (3) years. If more interest forms are submitted than available spots, a drawing will be held. First, a drawing will be conducted for members who have not attended in the past four years, but only if more than four people are interested. If there are still open spots after this, a second drawing will be held for the remaining spots. The drawing will occur immediately following the March 19, 2025, CAC meeting.

LEGISLATIVE UPDATES

• The Office of Government Relations (OGR): This office works to ensure that our school district and students benefit from important laws, funding, and rules at the state and federal levels. They advocate for better resources and support to improve students' learning experiences. By staying involved in government decisions, they help push for policies and budgets that align with the priorities of the school board and superintendent to boost student success. Each year, the District sponsors or co-sponsors legislation to add or modify existing state law that impacts California's public-school students. This year, the Board of Education adopted the 2025

Advocacy Agenda and Guiding Principles and Priorities on January 14, 2025.

DATA & METRIC

- **IEP Team Meetings:** From July 1, 2024, through February 28, 2025, LAUSD has successfully conducted 66,426 IEP team meetings. This value excludes the number of IEP team meetings completed at independent charter schools.
- **Enrollment:** As of February 28, 2025, LAUSD has 75,166 students with disabilities enrolled throughout District schools.

PARENT & COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT ACTIVITIES

- Very Special Arts Festival (VSAF) Save the Date: The Division of Special Education, in collaboration with The Music Center and the Los Angeles County Office of Education (LACOE), coordinates The Very Special Arts Festival (VSAF) for all grade levels. This inclusive event celebrates the artistic achievements of students of all abilities, featuring student artwork exhibitions and inclusive performances. The VSAF will take place over two days: on May 2nd, 2025, schools are invited to attend, and on May 3rd, 2025, the community is invited to attend VSAF Family Day. Both days will be held at The Music Center.
- Arts Fest 2025: Experience the LAUSD Arts Fest, where scholar artists showcase creativity, collaboration, and critical thinking. This event will elevate student talents, build community and unite the creative heartbeat of greater Los Angeles. This event will take place on May 3, 2025, in collaboration with VSAF Family Day.
