### **Key Dates for Change:**


Jan. 2012: Governor Brown proposes revamp of education funding in California through a Weighted Student Formula



### What is the LCAP?

The Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP) is the plan that describes how a District will utilize its state funds and support the high-needs students under LCFF.

#### The LCAP:

- Is a District-wide plan
- Encourages telling a story of support, impact and improvements for students
- Emphasizes good planning, communication and engagement

#### An LCAP must include:

- Stakeholder Engagement
- Goals and Progress Indicators
- Actions, Services and Expenditures

# Parent Advisory Requirement

# State law requires the District to establish and engage two parent advisory committees

- District-wide Parent Advisory Committee (PAC)
- District English Learner Advisory Committee (ELPAC/DELAC)
- Statute allows a District to utilize its existing DELAC to meet this requirement

#### **ESTABLISH:**



52063. (a) (1) The governing board of a school district shall **establish** a parent advisory committee to provide advice to the governing board of the school district and the superintendent...

52063. (b) (1) The governing board of a school district shall **establish** an English learner parent advisory committee...

Both committees were established and acknowledged in 2014 to fulfill this requirement


