



## Summary of Last Parent Advisory Committee Meeting

The following is a brief summary of the Parent Advisory Committee meeting held on April 22, 2021. You are welcome to use this summary to inform parents about the topics and comments discussed by the membership at Local District study groups, and school-site committee meetings.

- I. Local District PAC Member Introductions
  - a. Local District PAC members introduce themselves to the participants
- II. Responsibilities Assigned to the Parent Advisory Committee
  - a. What is the Local Control and Accountability Plan?
    - i. A plan that contains the District's 6 goals, actions and services that the District is taking to reach those goals, and the funds used in the District to support the actions and services.
    - ii. The plan is a 3-year plan, with the next cycle for the plan beginning in the 2021-2022 school year.
  - b. What is the Parent Advisory Committee?
    - i. A committee comprised of 55 representatives and 24 alternates who review and develop comments on the Local Control and Accountability Plan.
  - c. How can parents get involved and become members of the PAC?
    - i. Parents can view the meetings online and join the Local District LCAP Study Groups. In the Fall each year, new members are elected in each Local District from the Study Groups.
- III. Topics Discussed at the PAC Meeting on April 22, 2021
  - a. Recap: 2021-24 LCAP Development and Process
    1. Overview of the Draft 2021-24 LCAP  
Dr. Chau and team gave a brief overview of the 6 LCAP goals and draft actions: 100% Graduation, Proficiency for All, 100% Attendance, Parent, Student & Community Engagement, Basic Services, School Safety and Climate
    2. PAC Comment Development  
The PAC members were given the opportunity to discuss an LCAP goal as a group and record their thoughts/comments in ThoughtExchange or a Google Form. The PAC members were given 5 days to add additional comments.
  - b. The Superintendent's Student Advisory Council's area of focus is to share their perspective on the LCAP and encourage the PAC to advocate for increased funding to support student programs. Lastly their focus is to build and strengthen student voices throughout the district.
