#### WHAT IS A CHARTER SCHOOL?

"You never change things by fighting the existing reality. To change something, build a new model that makes the existing model obsolete."

#### A Charter School is...

- A public school
- Founded by teachers, parents, activists, universities, not-for-profits, etc.
- Accountable to the chartering/sponsoring entity
- Governed by a board of directors
- Generally autonomous from the district



#### A Charter School is...

Charter schools are public schools operating under a "charter," essentially a contract entered into between the school and its authorizing agency.



#### Minnesota - 1991

- Freedom from the traditional district framework: challenging the notion that public education should not be the exclusive domain of a government-sponsored monopoly
- School choice: expand public school choices for students, parents and teachers and to broaden the state's definition of "public education."



# NATIONAL AND LOCAL LANDSCAPE

#### **Today's Charter Landscape**

- 6,900 charter schools in 40 states + DC
- Serving more than 3 million students
- NOLA is 100% charter
- DC is over 50% charter



#### **CA Charter Law**

- Improve student learning
- Increased learning opportunities
- Different and innovative teaching methods
- New professional opportunities for teachers
- Provide parents/students with choices
- Hold schools accountable for performance-based measures
- Provide vigorous competition within the school system



#### **LA Charters**

- There are 277 charter schools:
  - 53 Affiliated, 224 Independent
- Serves more than 150,000 students in kindergarten through 12th grade.
- Charter School Division Office oversees the authorizing of these schools.

Only 1 district, LAUSD, has developed an in-depth model of district/charter collaboration to ensure accountability and equity of serving students with disabilities.





#### **LOCAL PLAN AND CHARTERS**

#### **Local Plan Points**

- Charter schools are mandated by state and federal law to adhere to all the provisions of IDEA.
- Charters must adhere to all terms and conditions of the MCD.
- Charters must ensure that no student otherwise eligible to enroll in their charter school will be denied enrollment due to a disability or to a charter school's inability to provide necessary services.



#### **Local Plan Points**

- CSD uses questions/rubrics as evaluation tools to determine whether or not a program meets required criteria.
- Outlines the build-out of two school sections under one SELPA.
- Prior to becoming authorized, the charter school must sign an MOU with LAUSD SELPA or show they are a member of another SELPA. If they sign with another SELPA, must provide that SELPA's LP to ensure a commitment that all District-authorized charter schools have a SELPA that maintains oversight, monitoring and implementing the MCD requirements.
