Preschool Programs in LAUSD



Early Education Centers (EEC) provide affordable or free, high-quality preschool programs for children aged 2 to 4. These programs are available year-round, operating from 7:00 AM to 5:30 PM. Enrollment does not require children to be potty-trained. The school follows the EEC academic calendar.

Infant Center Program provides affordable or free, high-quality care for infants and toddlers aged 6 weeks to 30 months. Our programs operate year-round, from 7:00 a.m. to 5:30 p.m., at four convenient locations. Spaces are limited, so we encourage interested families to reach out promptly.

Transitional Kindergarten (TK) offers a free educational opportunity for all children who will turn four years old on or before September 1 of the school year. This program is conveniently

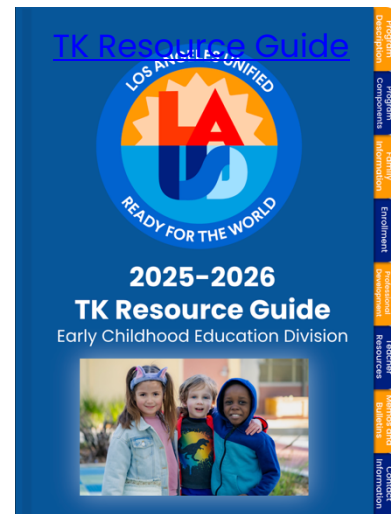

FREE LEARN-TO-SWIM PROGRAM FOR LAUSD STUDENTS

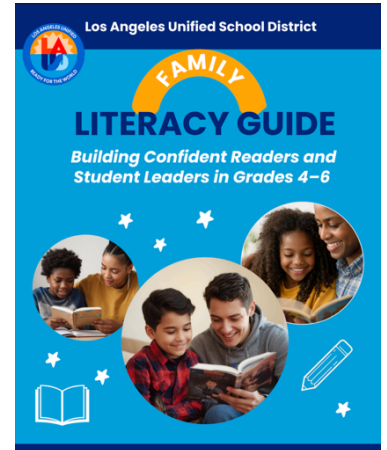

Exploring, Discovering and Building: Nurturing Scientist and Problem-solvers

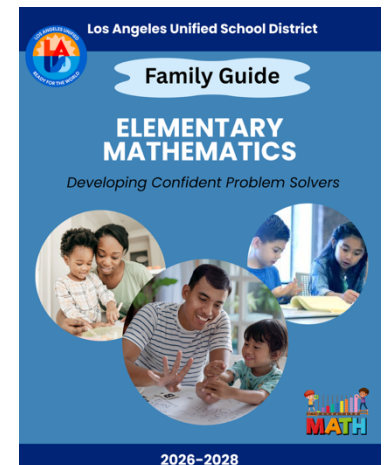
Families play a powerful role in helping students grow as curious thinkers and problem solvers in science. Responsibilities: DELAC shall advise the LAUSD Board of Education and the on the following tasks:

- Development of a district master plan for education programs and services for English learners. The district master plan will take into consideration the school site master plans.
- Conducting of a district-wide needs assessment on a school-by-school basis.
- Establishment of district program, goals, and objectives for programs and services for English learners.
- Development of a plan to ensure compliance with any applicable teacher and/or teacher aide requirements.
- Review and comment on the school district reclassification procedures.
- Review and comment on the written notifications required to be sent to parents and guardians.
- If the DELAC acts as the English learner parent advisory committee under California Education Code Sections 52063(b)(1) and 52062(a)(2), the DELAC shall also review and comment on the development or annual update of the Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP). *
- Under the LCFF, districts with at least 50 English learners and whose total enrollment includes at least 15% English learners establish a DELAC, and that DELAC must carry out specific responsibilities related to the LCAP.
