- ✓ Helping parents to acquire the necessary skills that will allow them to support the implementation of their child's IEP or individualized family service plan (IFSP)

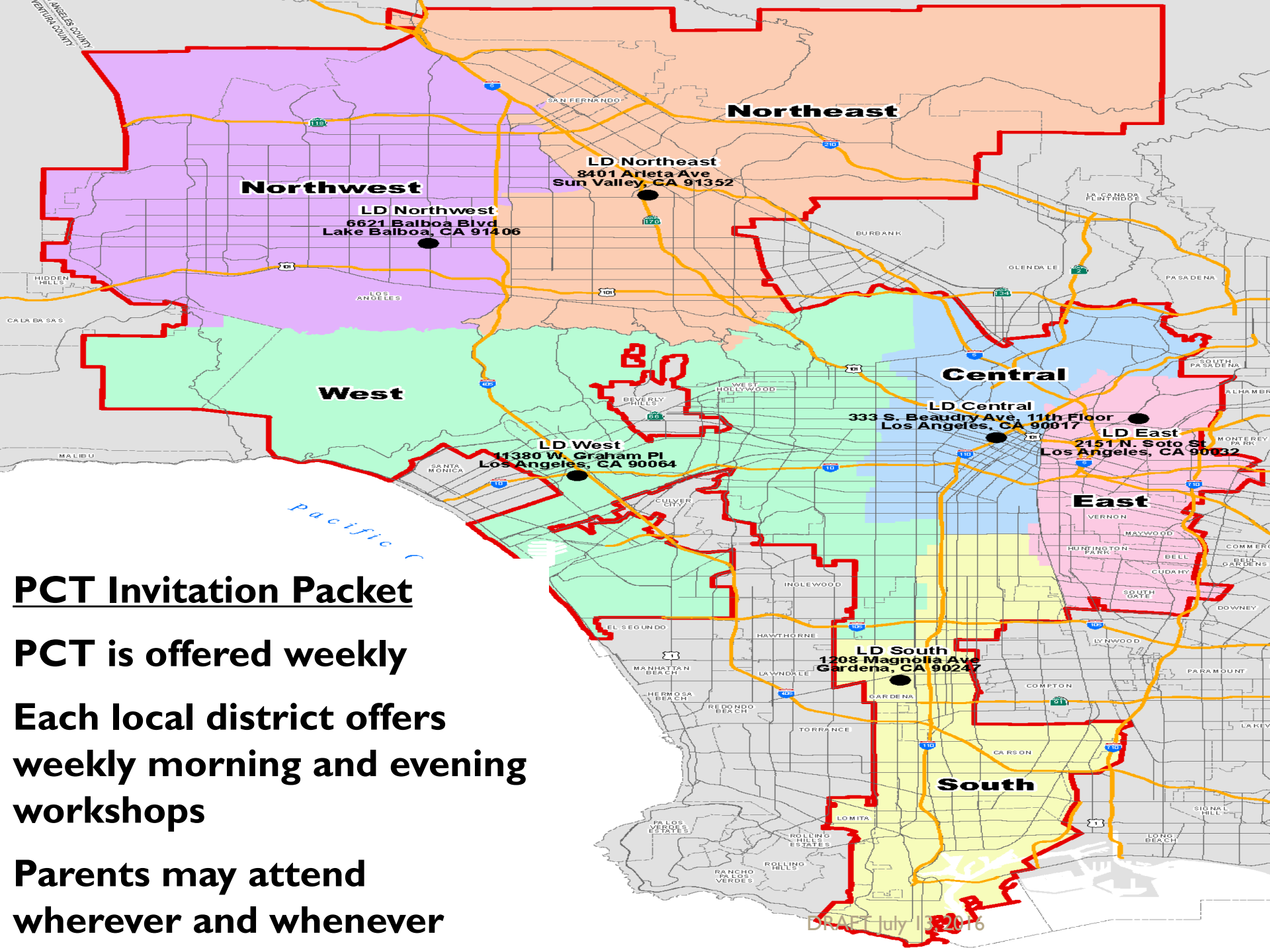
