Why are CEIS services needed?

- Reduce disproportionality and over-identification of specific student subgroups referred for special education
- Support schools in providing timely and effective intervention for struggling students
- Help school leadership teams coordinate the provision of behavioral and academic supports through a Multi-Tiered System of Supports (MTSS)

Academic Support

Early Language and Literacy Plan (ELLP) is a data-driven instructional approach designed to improve K-2 student achievement in Language and Literacy. MTSS Coaches will provide support to designated ELLP schools to address the needs of struggling readers. Support will include demonstration lessons, planning, data analysis, and professional development.



Behavior/Social-Emotional Support

CEIS will help participating schools develop and strengthen a Multi-Tiered System of Supports to address the behavioral and social-emotional needs of students. CEIS will work with school leadership teams to ensure that effective school-wide positive behavior supports are in place.

Parent/Family Engagement

CEIS Parent Facilitators will support participating schools in strengthening the home-school connection. CEIS Parent Facilitators will provide resources, training, and information about academic and positive behavioral strategies for use at home.
