

Accessibility & Accommodation Supports

Accessibility Supports (Universal Supports)

- All students
- Selection based on student preference



Designated Supports

- Available for any student as determined by an educator
(Audio support for Diagnostic- Grades 6+)

Accommodation

- **ONLY** available for students with a documented need (IEP or 504 plan)

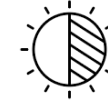

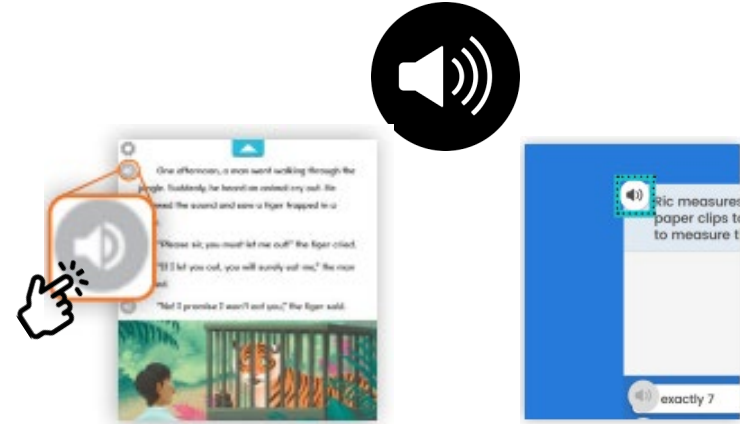

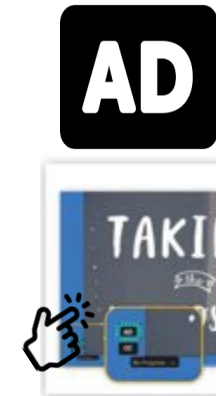
Audio Support

- Click on the audio button to hear the text of a question and/or answer read aloud



Audio Description

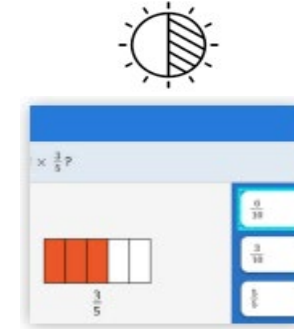
- Visual elements of video content are described with audio



Accessibility Features

Color Contrast

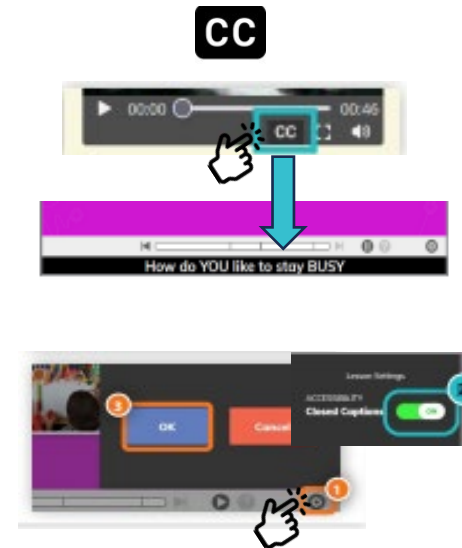
- Minimize the use of certain colors
- Meets the Web Content Accessibility Guidelines (WCAG) for minimum contrast between text or graphics against their backgrounds



Closed Captioning

- View text on screen that aligns with audio presented

*CC can be enabled by selecting the settings icon.



Accessibility Features

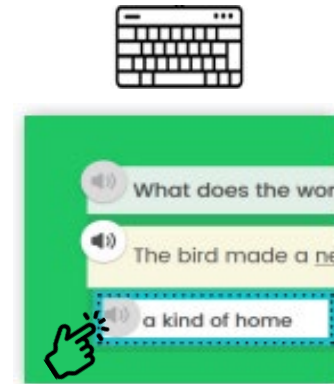
Keyboard Navigation

- Use the keyboard instead of the mouse to navigate

***Press Tab:** To "Turn On" keyboard navigation and to go to the next interactive item (e.g., button or link)

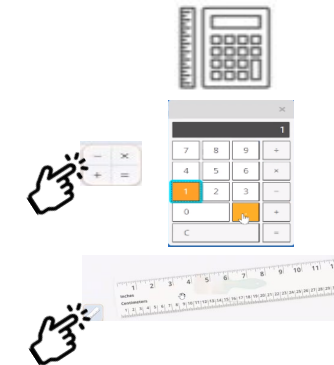
Shift + Tab: To move back

Enter or Space: To select and/or open the interactive element (e.g., button or link)



Math Digital Tools

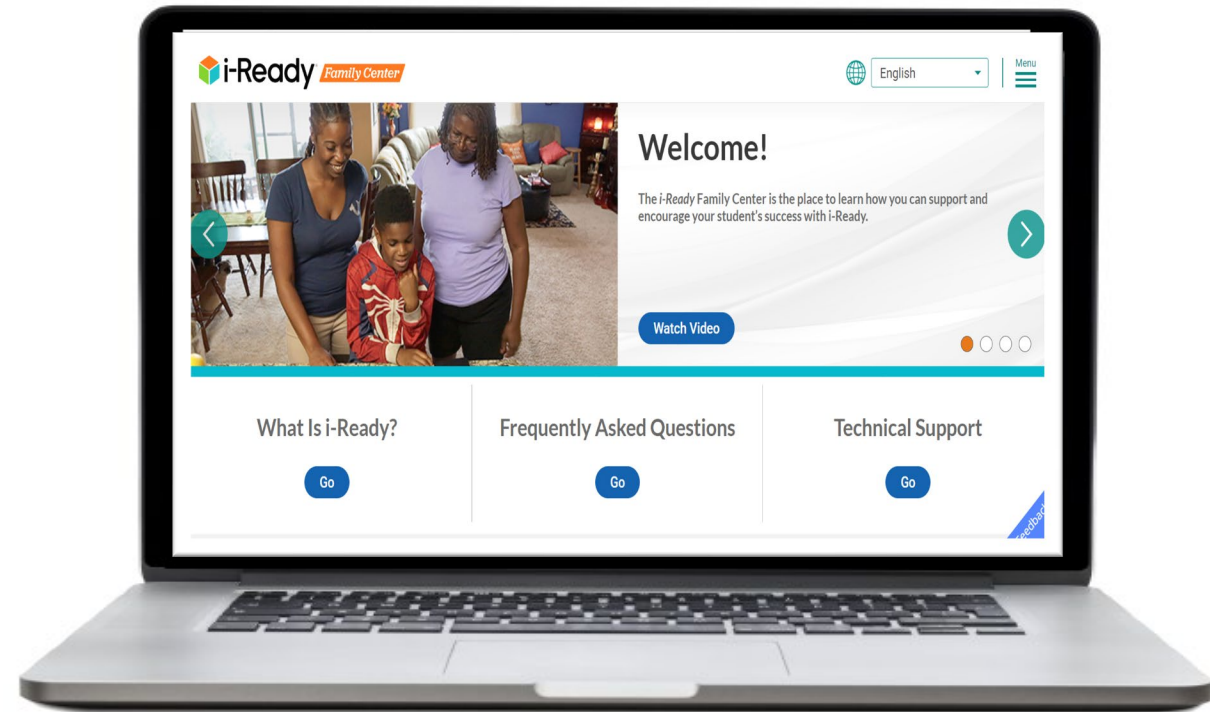
- Tools such as protractors, rulers, and calculators are embedded and activated by selecting the tool icon

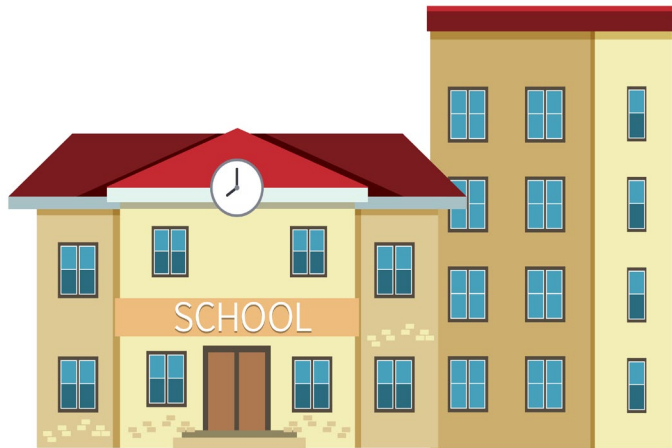

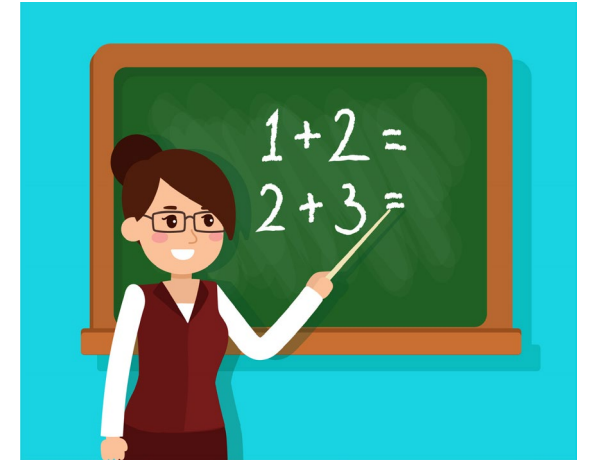
