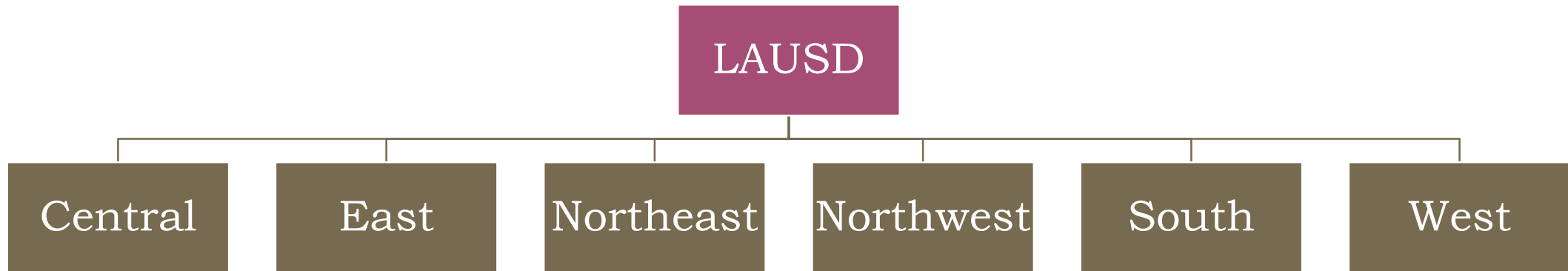


Parent and Community Representative Training in the Local Districts

In each Local District, schools are organized by high school feeder pattern and by Director

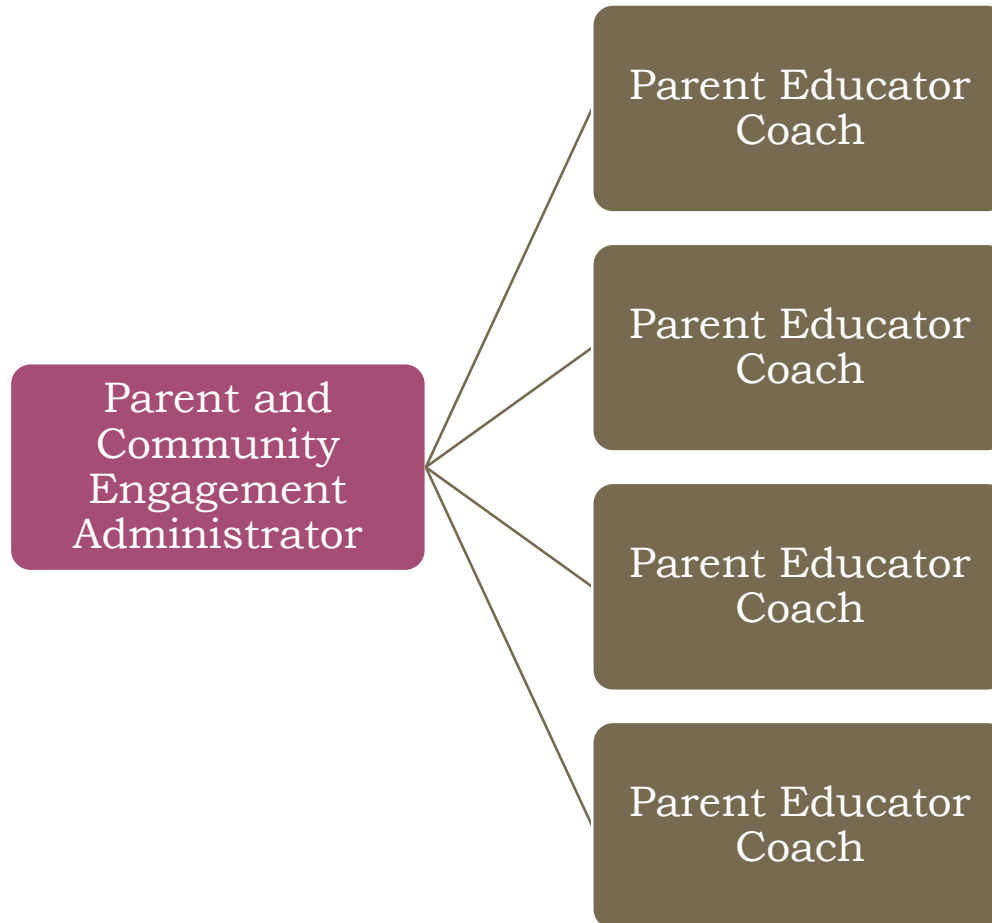
An administrator that may supervise principals

Parent Educator Coaches meet **monthly** with 30-40 Community Representatives in their network of schools which is organized by feeder pattern or Director.



Coordination with Special Education Leaders in Local Districts

- Parent Educator Coaches meet with Special Education staff in their Local District
- Coaches meet with Assistant Principals in charge of Special Education services in schools
- Coaches partner in outreach efforts to publicize Parent Trainings on topics related to Special Education
- Coaches do presentations at school sites
