Committee Description: Parent Advisory Committee (PAC)

The Parent Advisory Committee is required, under CA Education Code, section 52061, to review and provide comments on the Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP), which describes the use of general funds in the Los Angeles Unified School District (LAUSD). The PAC is comprised of 55 representatives and 24 alternates elected from each Local District and selected by LAUSD Board of Education members. To fulfill their duties, the PAC members attend training and collaborate with LAUSD staff to learn more about the plan and the students it serves.

Parent Advisory Committee Learning Plan

This year's learning sequence will focus on the eight goals of the Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP): 100% Graduation, Proficiency for All, Excellent Attendance, Parent, Student & Community Engagement, School Safety and Climate, Basic Services, English Learner Supports, and Black Student Achievement Plan.

From November 2022 through April 2023, LAUSD divisions will present the program indicators and funding associated with each goal. In addition, the membership will develop comments to strengthen the District's LCAP, which will be submitted to the LAUSD Superintendent. Finally, the PAC members will meet to review the Superintendent's responses to the PAC's comments in June, along with an outline of the 2021-2024 LCAP to be presented for review to the PAC before the LCAP's adoption in June.

PAC members receive training related to their duties of reviewing and commenting on the District's LCAP throughout the year. In addition, they meet with various District office leaders to discuss District and family priorities related to student achievement.

Committee Meeting and Training Structure

PAC members are provided learning opportunities during training meetings, held from 10:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. via Zoom online. Additional training is offered on various topics and also provided via Zoom online.

The agendas for PAC meetings are posted online and outside the building at the Office of the Parent and Community Services. The training agendas are posted online on the Office of Parent and Community Services website.

PAC members are expected to spend at least fifteen hours per semester studying and analyzing information related to the District's LCAP.

Meeting Norms:

The Parent Advisory Committee members are required to follow the Meeting Norms, Guidelines for a Safe and Welcoming Environment, and the Rules of Decorum.

The following is a list of the meeting norms:

- I/We will keep students as a priority.
- I/We will provide every person with a <u>safe and welcoming</u> environment.
- I/We will listen attentively and not interrupt each other.
- I/We will speak <u>respectfully</u> and briefly.
- I/We will stay <u>focused</u> on the meeting topics.
- I/We believe that we can agree to disagree.
- I/We believe there might be more than one solution to a problem.

Attendance Policy:

Representatives are allowed a total of (3) three absences from regularly scheduled meetings per membership year. Members must be present for 2 hours during each meeting to be counted as present. When applicable, members are eligible for childcare reimbursement for attending meetings and training.

Participation:

There are many opportunities available to participate in the discussion, deliberation, and decision-making at Parent Advisory Committee Meetings. Members may be recognized by the Committee Chairperson and make motions or engage in debate on the floor. Any person of the public may sign up to speak during the Public Comment items on the agenda. During training, members may engage freely by raising hands to be recognized by a presenter.

Communication:

Members receive regular email, text, and Blackboard Connect Ed. messages to communicate information related to meetings and trainings.
