**Maria Daisy Ortiz:**

1.) How many middle schools are trained in Restorative Justice?

**Response:** Approximately 79 Middle Schools have been trained in both levels of Restorative Justice.

2.) Who gets trained?

**Response:** The training is offered to certificated staff at each school site (teachers, counselors, administrators, coordinators, etc.)

3.) How many staff from each school site?

**Response:** The District offers two levels of training in Restorative Justice Community Building and Harm and Reentry, which is conducted over two successive years. The Community Building training usually requires a team of five (schools with populations under 200 students may request an exemption from this requirement. They are allowed to send no less than two staff members). The Harm and Reentry training requires a team of two from each school.

**Roberto Fonseca:** What was the participation rate of the students who responded to the survey question on school safety? This data is not currently available. The Research and Reporting branch is looking into it. All students from grades 3 to 12 were required to take the survey.
