Overview

Title I is a federally funded program authorized under the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) of 1965, reauthorized as the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). The goal of the program is to provide all children with an opportunity to receive a fair, equitable, and high-quality education to close educational achievement gaps (Every Student Succeeds Act, 2023).

The Consolidated Application (ConApp) – a two-part application and reporting process used by the California Department of Education (CDE) to distribute categorical funds from various federal programs to the District – mandates that local education agencies (LEAs) adopt a policy requiring the evaluation of categorical programs. This report examines Title I, Part A activities for the 2023-24 school year, including school designations, resource allocations, summaries of the Centrally Funded Programs (CFP), in-depth analyses of School Plan for Student Achievement (SPSA) evaluations, and finally Smarter Balanced Assessment (SBA) results for the 2023-24 academic year. LAUSD’s Federal and State Education Programs (FSEP) Branch provides technical support for all Title I, Part A activities and requirements, including those listed above.

Purpose of Title I, Part A

Title I, Part A provides financial assistance to LEAs and schools with high numbers or high percentages of children from low-income families to help ensure that all children meet state academic standards (Improving Basic Programs Operated by Local Educational Agencies - Title I, Part A, 2018). This funding is designed to meet the educational needs of low-achieving students enrolled in the highest poverty schools. Funds support the use of effective, evidence-based educational strategies to close the achievement gap both at the district (i.e., CFP) and school-site level. Federal Title I, Part A funds are supplemental to State funds schools receive for providing an educational program for all students and services required by law for English Learners and children with disabilities (CDE, 2023c).

LAUSD operates two school-based programs under Title I, Part A: Targeted Assistance School (TAS) and Schoolwide Program (SWP). The allocations for both TAS and SWP are based on the percentage of students who meet low-income status. The use of those funds, however, is to focus on students most at-risk of not meeting academic standards at the school, regardless of their income level. For TAS, students are identified based on multiple, objective criteria (e.g., academic performance, teacher recommendation, and personal circumstances – homelessness, migrant students, and youth in juvenile correctional facilities), whereas for SWP, all students can be served, including students with disabilities and English Learners. Schools where 45% or more of students are low income are designated as Title I schools. In 2023-24, 719 (92%) of the district’s 784 schools were designated as Title I schools. For the full 2023-24 Title I Rank Distribution, refer to Appendix A of this document.

California School Dashboard

On December 10, 2015, President Obama signed the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA), reauthorizing the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) and replacing the No Child Left Behind Act (NCLB), the 2001 reauthorization of ESEA. California’s ESSA state plan (California ESSA Consolidated State Plan, 2022) includes an overview of the California accountability model (California Model), which presents school and district progress using multiple student outcome indicators that contribute to quality education. Each outcome is reported to the public through the California School Dashboard, an online tool that displays the performance of schools and student groups to assist in identifying strengths and areas in need of improvement. The Dashboard provides information about each indicator, the school’s performance level (i.e., color) for each, and the change from the prior year. Each year, CDE releases a technical guide that explains the features and business rules of the Dashboard (2022 California School Dashboard Technical Guide: Introduction, 2023).

School Designations

In addition to Title I, ESSA includes other components of a broader system of support designed to help all schools improve student outcomes - Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) and Additional Targeted Support and Improvement (ATSI). Title I provides funding that can be used to support schools in CSI and ATSI, as well as to implement schoolwide programs (SWP). The State of California uses indicators of school performance on the Dashboard to determine school eligibility for CSI and ATSI. School identification categories are hierarchical, and schools can only be identified in one category for any given school year: CSI–Low Graduation, CSI–Lowest Performing Schools, and Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) or ATSI.

The 2023 identification of schools included CSI–Low Graduation status consisting of schools that had a three-year average high school graduation rate below 68 percent. This graduation rate

criterion applied to both Title I and non-Title I schools. To be eligible for identification in this category, schools had to have graduation rate data for 2020, 2021, and 2022, and have 30 or more students eligible for graduation in each year. Title I-funded schools identified for CSI based on graduation rate are removed from the pool prior to the identification of Title I-funded schools in the CSI–Lowest Performing Schools category (2022 California School Dashboard Technical Guide: ESSA Assistance, 2022).

The CSI–Lowest Performing Schools category consists of schools that received Title I funds for the 2022-23 school year and were the lowest performing based on the 2022 Dashboard data. CSI–Lowest Performing Schools were identified with performance color combinations at the school-level on the following indicators: English language arts/literacy, Mathematics, English Learner Progress, Graduation Rate, Suspension Rate, Chronic Absenteeism, and English Learner Progress Indicator (ELPI). The College and Career Indicator only had one year of data to report on the 2022 Dashboard so it was reported as a status level (no performance color). As a result, the College and Career Indicator only contributed towards identification if a school had Very Low Status, in which case it was considered red for the purposes of identification. At least five percent of the Title I-funded schools across the state must be identified in this category, using the following hierarchical criteria, which are applied until the state reaches the minimum threshold: 1) all red indicators (lowest performance level); 2) all red but one indicator of another color; 3) schools with five or more indicators where the majority are red; and 4) all red and orange indicators. Schools that were eligible for CSI–Low Performing in prior years but are no longer Title I funded will continue to be in CSI until they meet the exit criteria – does not meet eligibility criteria and has shown improvement on at least one indicator at the lowest performance level from the prior year.

Schools that are not identified for CSI are eligible for TSI or ATSI if they have one or more student groups (i.e., race/ethnicity, homeless students, English learner students, foster youth students, students with disabilities, or socioeconomically disadvantaged students) that meets the same criteria as CSI–Lowest Performing Schools for two consecutive years. Typically, TSI eligibility is determined annually and ATSI eligibility is determined every three years. However, due to the COVID-19 pandemic, ATSI determinations were made in 2022–23 and 2023–24 and TSI determinations will be made in 2024–25 using data from the 2024 Dashboard. Schools initially eligible for ATSI in the 2019–20 year will be reevaluated in the 2022–2023 year to determine continued eligibility or exit. A school is no longer eligible if they no longer meet the eligibility criteria and if the low performing student group which initially identified them for ATSI showed improvement on at least one state indicator at the lowest performance level percent by at least 0.1 from 2019 to 2022.

Title I TAS schools use funds received only for programs that provide services to eligible students identified as having the greatest need for special assistance. Eligible children are identified by the school as failing to meet the state's challenging academic achievement standards. In TAS's only, students identified as Title I-eligible may receive services funded by Title I. Students eligible for Title I services are (i) children not older than age 21 who are entitled to a free public education through grade 12; and (ii) children who are not yet at a grade level at which the District provides a free public education. A student is eligible for Title I services if identified by the school staff as failing or most at-risk of failing to meet state academic achievement standards. The identification of Title I eligible students must be based on multiple, educationally related, objective criteria established by the District and supplemented by the school, except that children from pre-school through grade 2 shall be selected solely on the basis of such criteria as teacher judgment, or other developmentally appropriate measures.

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, California received a federal accountability waiver of all 2020 Dashboard reporting requirements (CDE, 2023a) and in addition, students statewide experienced learning loss between 2019 and 2022 (see the Smarter Balanced Assessment section of this report, p. 22). Therefore, there was a dramatic increase in the number of LAUSD schools designated as CSI or ATSI for 2023-24 (see full list in Appendix B). In 2023-24, the CDE identified 60 CSI and 553 ATSI schools for a total of 613 schools. Of the 60 CSI schools identified, 19 were CSI–Low Graduation Rate Schools and 41 were CSI–Lowest Performing Schools. Most CSI–Low Graduation Rate Schools were Dashboard Alternative School Status (DASS) schools, accounting for 37 of the 41 (90%) schools. Unlike CSI–Low Graduation Rate Schools, the majority of CSI–Lowest Performing Schools (16 of 19 or 84%), were traditional schools. Additionally, there were 19 other DASS schools with no CSI status. When summarized by school group, as shown in Table 2 below, ATSI schools consisted of elementary, middle, senior high and span schools. Elementary accounted for the majority (433 or 78%) of the 553 schools identified as ATSI schools.¹

¹ Categories were used in alignment with the LAUSD Office of Data & Accountability (ODA): Elementary, Middle Schools, and Senior High categories includes Magnet Centers, Magnet Self-Contained Schools, Dual Language Centers (DLC), and Other Learning Centers of the respective grade levels; Span schools are any schools the cross over two grade span levels, including Magnets; Option schools are alternative schools (i.e., Continuation High Schools, Opportunity Schools/Units, Community Day Schools, and Carlson Home Hospital); and Special Ed are learning centers dedicated specifically to Special Education.

Resource Allocations

In 2023-24, the Title I budget, which accounted for a state adjustment resulting in a reduction in the previous year’s allocation, was approximately \$490.5M; this includes the 2023-24 Entitlement of \$360.9M and a 2022-23 carryover of \$129.5M. As is done each year, the budget was divided into four groups: Title I Schools, Centrally Funded Programs, Other, and year-end 2023-24 balance. California Education Code requires LEAs to use at least 85 percent of Title I funds on direct services. In 2023-24, LAUSD exceeded the minimum requirement for direct services to schools, which includes centrally funded services and equitable services in participating private schools (included in the “Other” category) shown in Table 3 below.

Centrally Funded Programs Allocations

Approximately 23% of the 2023-24 Title I Budget was used for Centrally Funded Programs that provide direct services to schools. These programs are administered centrally by individual departments, including the Division of Instruction (DOI), Student Health and Human Services (SHHS), Beyond the Bell (BTB), and the Office of Student, Families, and Community Engagement (SFACE).

School Allocations

The Title I Schools allocation accounted for 72% percent of the budget. These funds are available to schools whose percentage of low-income students – based on the free and reduced meal application² – was greater than or equal to 45 percent. For eligible schools, the per-school amount was calculated by multiplying the number of low-income students by each school’s per-pupil-allocation listed in the 2023-24 Poverty Ranking Funding Formula in Table 4 below.

Enrollment for the Title I rank in 2023-24 is based on E-CAST, a projected enrollment dataset used to calculate the number of teaching positions for the new school year or the California Basic Educational Data System (CBEDS). Title I ranks are then based on their predicted percentage of low-income students of all students enrolled (e.g., 100 percent is equal to rank 1). The district uses this rank to determine which schools are eligible to receive their allocation.

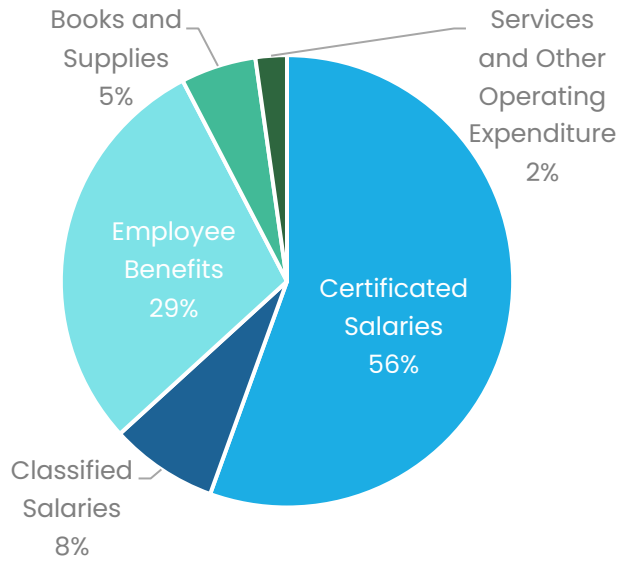
The categories with the largest proportion of the Title I Schools budget allocation were certificated salaries and employee benefits, accounting for 85% of the total allocations (Figure 1). Other categories, such as books and supplies, classified salaries, and other operating expenditures and services made up significantly smaller portions of the allocation, accounting for about eight percent or less of the total budget.

² Community Eligibility Provisions (CEP) a federal program that allows schools to provide free meals to all students, regardless of income. Schools and districts can choose to participate in the CEP if they have a high percentage of students eligible for free or reduced-price meals.

³ Hold Harmless schools are those that were ranked Title I in prior years and falling below 45% poverty for the first time in FY 2023-24.

Centrally Funded Program Evaluation

Table 5 lists the allocations and expenditures of centralized Title I funds in 2023-2024. Approximately \$19.1M of the amount reflected in Table 3 are not included in Table 5 below, including 1) Supplemental Academic Supports/Tools (\$15.2M) - digital tools and resources provided to schools, 2) Prior Year Adjustments (\$525K) - which are applied across multiple programs to account for salary or benefit changes; and 3) Mentor Summer Program (\$3.3M), which was funded with other funding sources after being redesigned and expanded.

Table 6 provides a brief description of each program and whether the program objectives were “met” in 2023-24. Each program had goals specific to the program and evaluated these goals in a report submitted to the FSEP at the middle and end of each year of implementation. However, the evaluations of the School Site Council (SSC) Training are done internally for feedback and improvement and are not included.

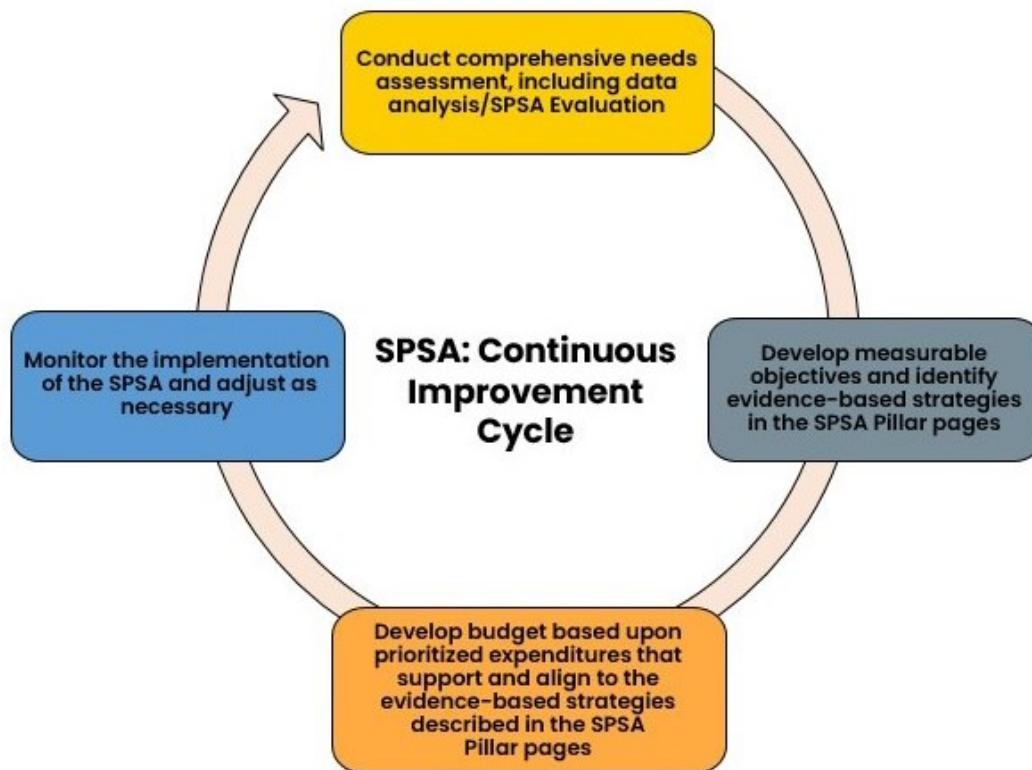

School Plans for Student Achievement

California Education Code 64001 requires districts receiving funding through the Consolidated Application (ConApp), including Title I funds ensure that participating schools write an SPSA (CDE, 2023b). Additionally, California Education Code 52852 requires Title I schools to establish a School Site Council (SSC) as the decision-making council for all programs funded through the ConApp. Each SSC is responsible for developing, reviewing, and approving the SPSA. The purpose of the SPSA is to: 1) Create a cycle of continuous improvement of student performance; 2) Raise the academic performance outcomes of all students to the level of state achievement standards; and 3) Ensure that all students succeed in reaching academic standards set by the State Board of Education.

The goals and activities described in the SPSA must be aligned to data that will address specific student needs. The SPSA includes: a comprehensive needs assessment (data analysis and annual SPSA self-evaluation), develop measurable objectives based on student data and evidence-based strategies that address student needs, the Title I budget, and a process for monitoring implementation of planned actions. Throughout the school year, Title I schools engage in a Cycle of Continuous Improvement to develop, implement, and monitor the SPSA (Figure 2; LAUSD, n.d.).

Figure 2: SPSA Cycle of Continuous Improvement



According to California Education Code 64001(g), the SSC must evaluate the effectiveness of the SPSA at least one time each year (CDE, 2023b). The annual review and evaluation of the SPSA by the SSC ensures programs and interventions described in the schoolwide plan are implemented as designed and implemented in a way that positively affects student achievement. Furthermore, the review and evaluation comprise an integral component of the Compensatory Education (CE) Federal Program Monitoring (FPM) review process for SPSAs. During an FPM review, the SSC must provide evidence of the evaluation process to determine if the needs of students are being met by the strategies described in the SPSA. Data must be used to evaluate the effectiveness of categorical resources and the effect on the instructional program. Schools are to use multiple measures, such as curriculum-based assessments, student work, SBA data, California School Dashboard results, and surveys to evaluate and revise the school's SPSA. If the analysis of school data indicates minimal or no growth, revisions must be made to the instructional program to ensure annual gains in student achievement.

The transition to an online SPSA system in 2017-18 enabled relatively easy consolidation and analysis of SPSAs to describe the content and characteristics of the responses. For 2023-24, all 719 Title I schools submitted online SPSAs (hereinafter referred to as the *Title I schools*). School measurable objectives across seven SPSA pillars (previously referred to as goals or goal types), which were updated in 2023-24 to align to the pillars of the LAUSD 2022-26 Strategic Plan⁵: Graduation, and College and Career Readiness (hereinafter referred to as *Grad/C&C*); English Language Arts (*ELA*); *Mathematics*; English Learner Programs (*EL Programs*); Engagement and Collaboration (*Engage & Collab*); *Joy & Wellness*; and *Other Academic Content*.⁶

The SPSA outlines each school's measurable objectives based on their goals for student improvement. These objectives demonstrate the effectiveness of SPSA implementation for improving student achievement and will answer the question, "Did our strategies and actions lead to improved outcomes such as increased student achievement, or behavior/attitude shifts?" They are SMART Goals based on formative and summative data tied to district and state priorities. In the absence of prior years' SBA data and CA Dashboard indicators (2019-20 and 2020-21), contributors were instructed to look at alternative measures for needs assessments and look at objectives in a new way as they evaluate the SPSA.

To assist school site staff in shifting their lens, implementation objectives were added to the SPSA in 2021-22. FSEP instructed school site staff to develop at least one measurable implementation objective per SPSA pillar. These objectives are meant to assist school site staff in

monitoring progress toward the improvement objectives, aligned to their strategies and actions, and answering the question, “Were our strategies carried out?” These implementation objectives 1) are measured at the school with potential leading indicators to track throughout the year, 2) determine effectiveness of strategies and allow course correction as needed, and 3) align with the plan so that the school will know if its strategies were implemented with fidelity.

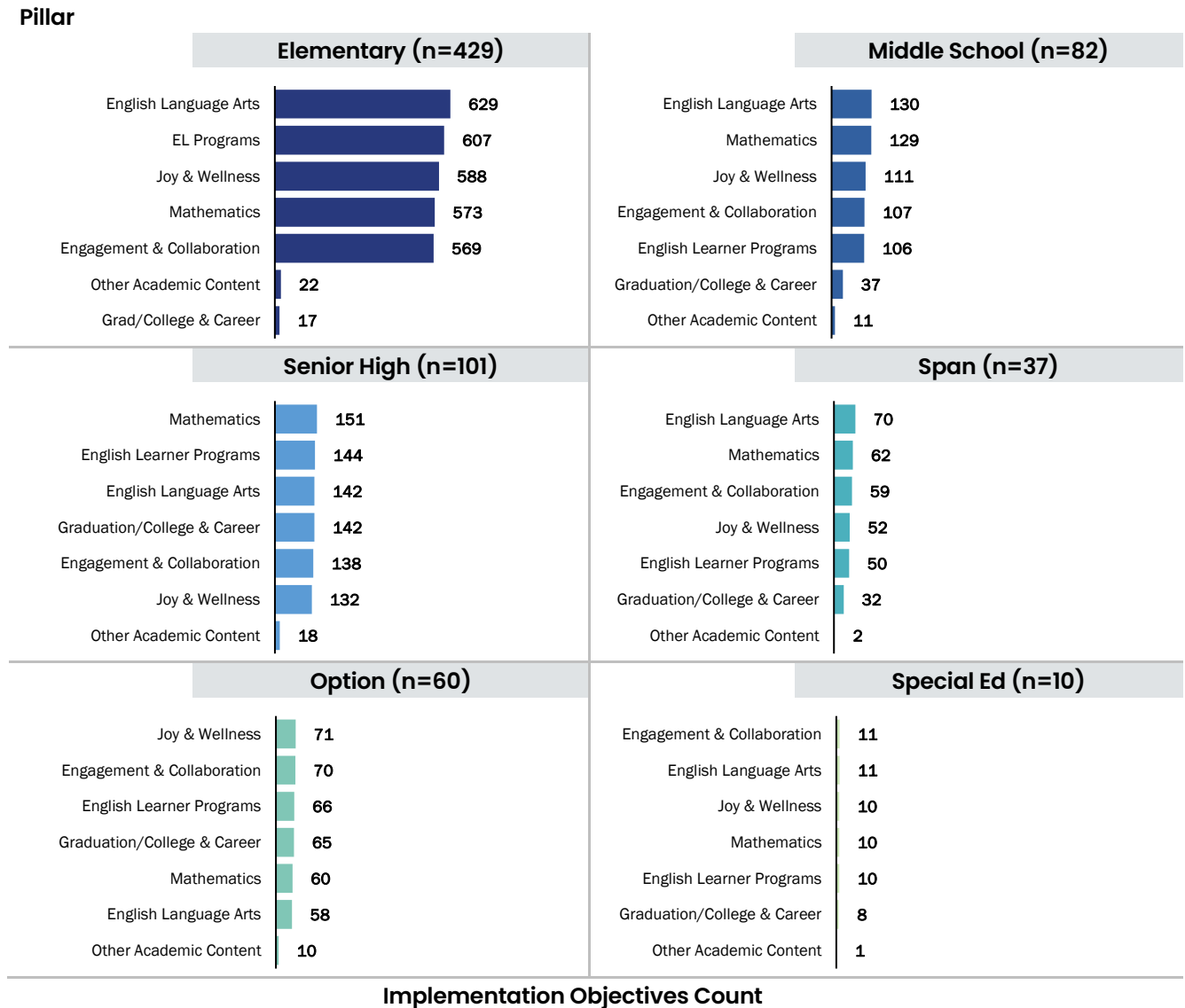
In the fall of the following school year, school site staff self-evaluate their progress on each objective also through the SPSA platform. In the self-evaluations, schools indicated whether they “met” each of their measurable objectives and provide responses to why the objectives were “met” or “not met,” and checked all strategies that did or did not work (e.g., Consistent/ effective or lacking/ inconsistent/ ineffective PD implementation). The following in-depth analyses of SPSA evaluations include a snapshot of the data overall, then a quantitative analysis looking for any differences by school type and pillar. The analyses for implementation and improvement objectives are provided separately below.

Implementation Objectives

In total, schools created 5,291 valid measurable implementation objectives across the seven pillars. All objectives that were either left blank or “Not Applicable” were removed from further analyses. The pillars with the most implementation objectives created were *ELA* (1,040 objectives) and *Math* (985 objectives), making up 20% and 19%, respectively, of the total number of implementation objectives. The fewest number of implementation objectives created were for *Other Academic Content*, which comprised 1% (64) of all objectives. The majority (57%) of all implementation objectives were created by elementary schools. Schools created, on average, 7.4 objectives across the seven pillars, with the number of objectives ranging from 3 to 26.

When comparing the number of objectives by school type, as shown in Figure 3 below, a similar number of objectives were created for each pillar, except for *Grad/C&C* and *Other Academic Content*. *ELA* and *Mathematics* remained a top priority for most school types followed by *EL Programs*. While more *Grad/C&C* objectives were created for Senior High (47%) and Option (22%) schools, *Other Academic Content* remained low across all school types. In addition, *Engage & Collab* was emphasized more in the Option, Span, and Special Education schools than the other school types.

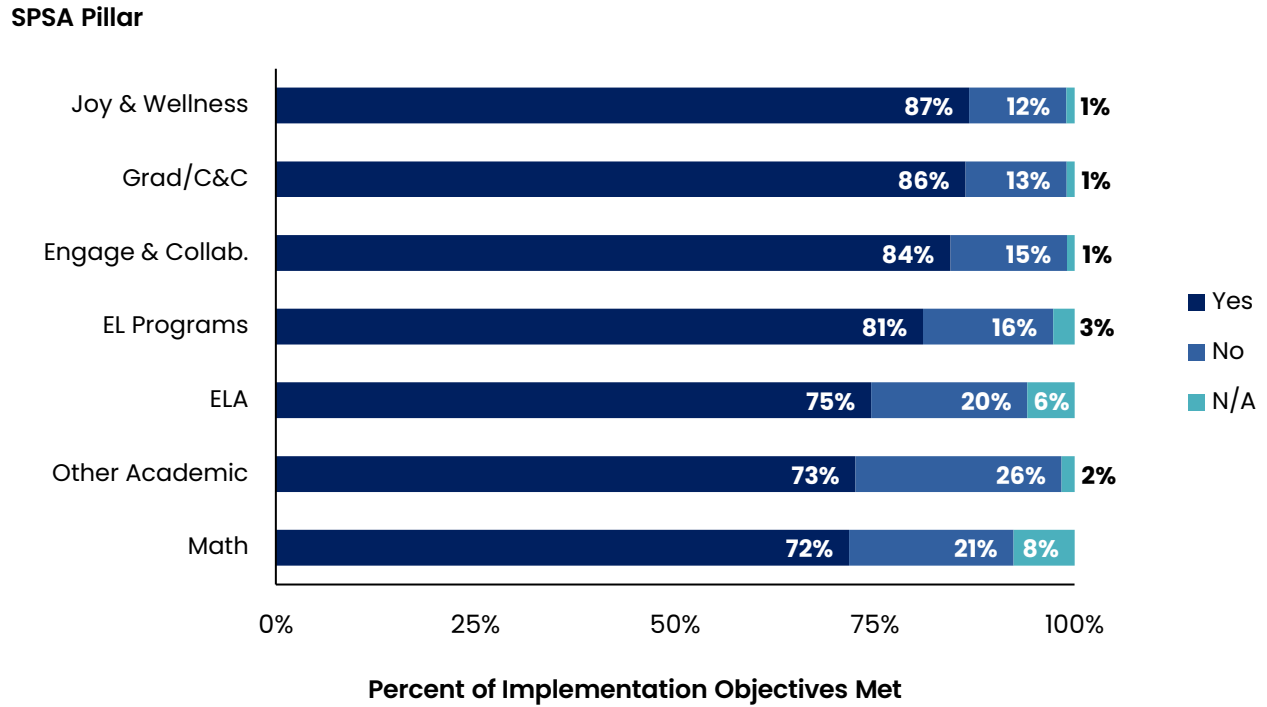
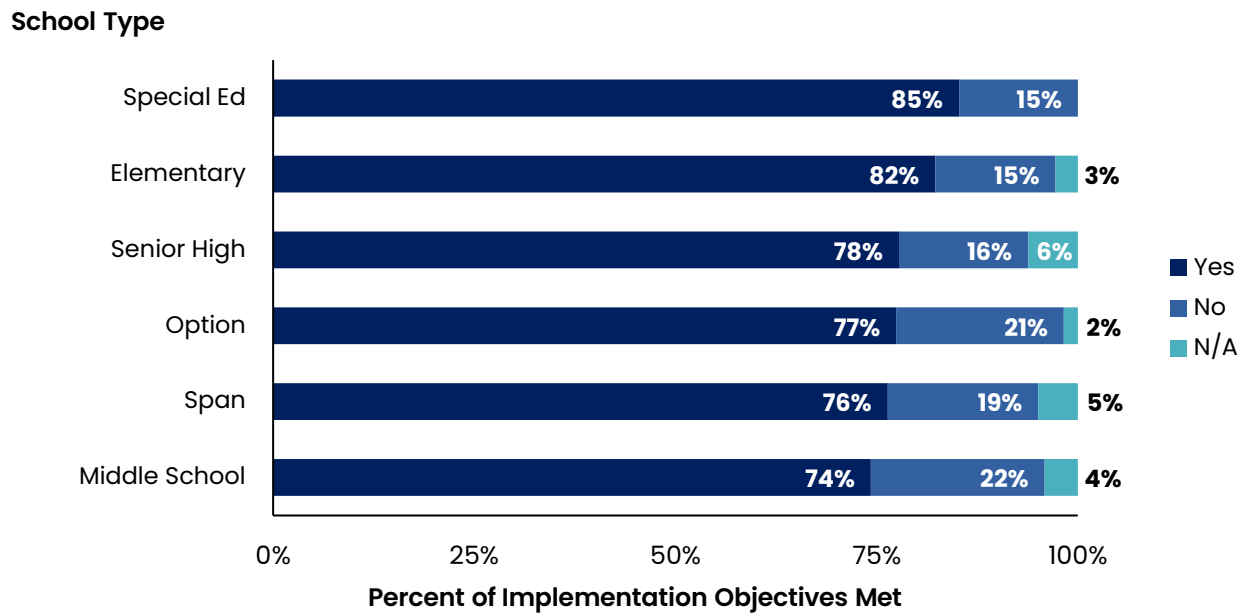


Figure 5: Percent of Implementation Objectives Met by School Type

Figures 4 and 5 below show the percentage of implementation objectives “met” by pillar and school type, respectively.⁷ Roughly 80% of the objectives were “met” by both pillar and school type. The self-evaluations show that schools have met most of their implementation objectives in all categories. However, the academic objectives (i.e., *ELA*, *Math*, and *Other Academic Content*) had the most room for improvement by pillar, with 20% of more of objectives “not met.” Similarly, by school type (Figure 5), special education centers (n=10) and elementary schools (n=429) met the largest proportion of their implementation objectives (85% and 82%,

respectively) and had the fewest objectives evaluated as “not applicable,” whereas middle schools (n=82) had the least proportion of met objective at 74%.

Figure 4: Percent of Implementation Objectives Met by SPSA Pillar

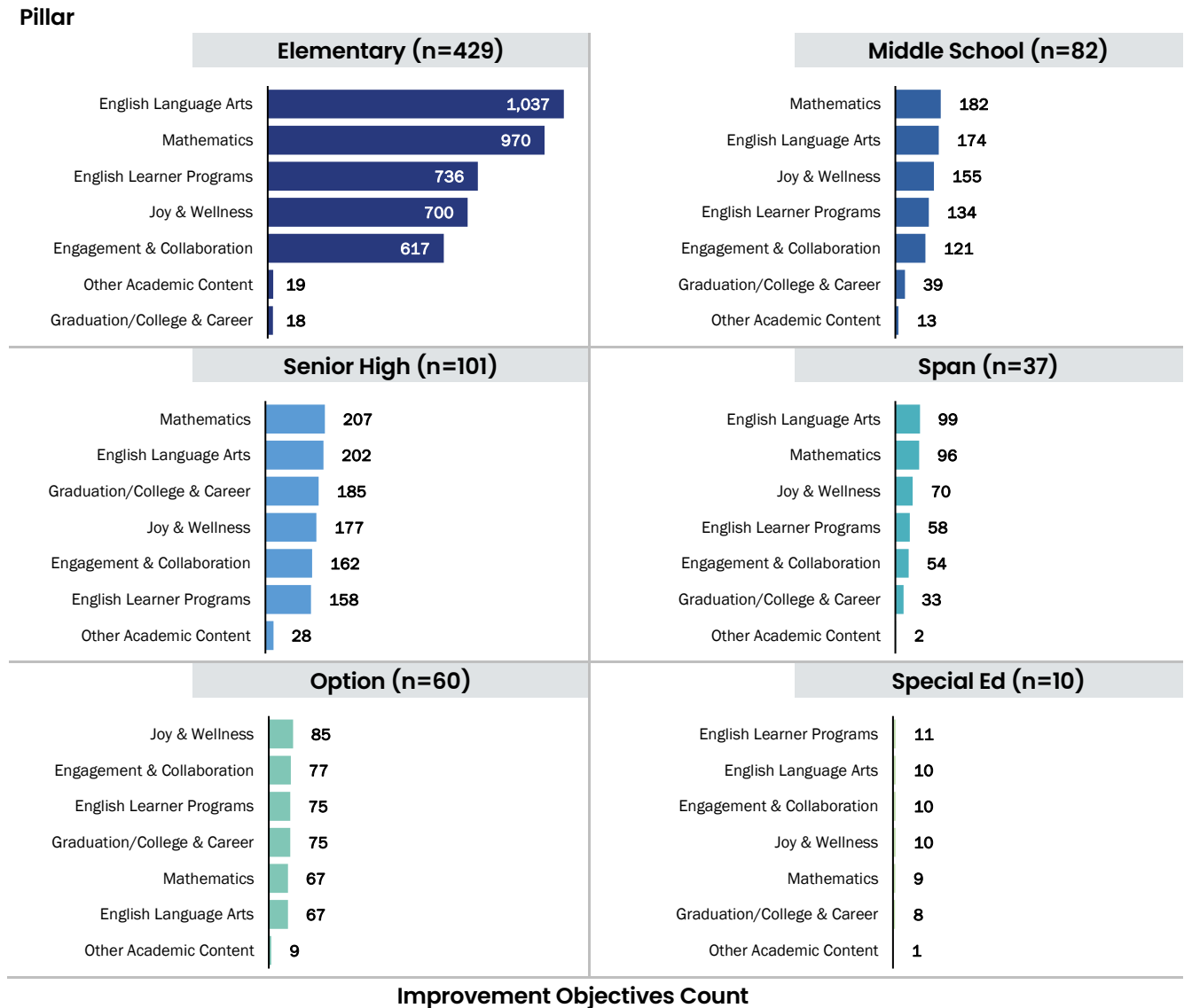


Improvement Objectives

Overall, there were a total of 6,960 valid measurable improvement objectives created across the seven pillars for 719 Title I schools. All objectives that were either left blank or “Not Applicable” were removed from further analyses. The pillars with the most improvement objectives created were *ELA* and *Mathematics*, comprising 23% (1,589) and 22% (1,531) of all improvement objectives, respectively. The fewest number of improvement objectives were created for the *Grad/C&C* pillar (5% or 359) with 52% of that being created by Senior High schools and 21% by Option schools, followed by *Other Academic Content* (1% or 71).

Schools created on average 9.7 objectives across the seven pillars, with a minimum of three objectives and as many as 40. However, the number of objectives created across pillars was significantly greater at the Elementary level than all other school types. When comparing the number of objectives by school type, as shown in Figure 6 below, most schools had similar priorities. *ELA* was the top pillar for Elementary and Span schools. *Mathematics* was the top pillar for Middle and Senior High schools. *Joy & Wellness* was the top pillar at Option schools.

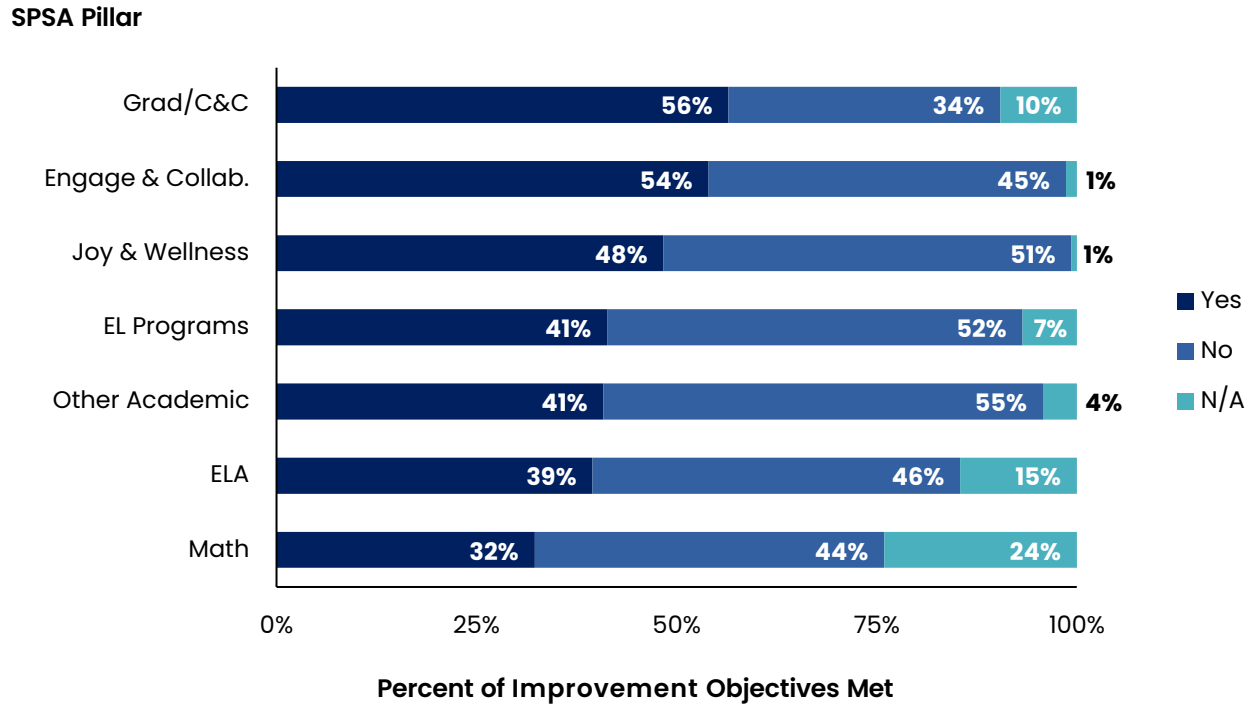
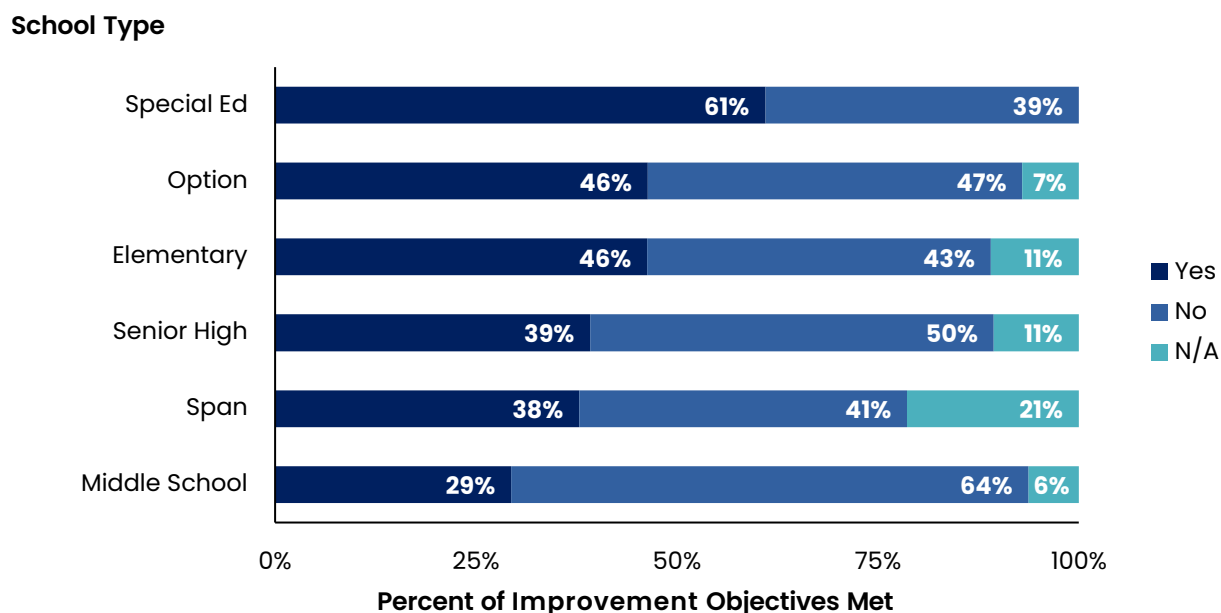


Figure 8: Percent of Improvement Objectives Met by School Type

Figures 7 and 8 below shows the percentage of improvement objectives “met” by pillar.⁸ Based on the LEA evaluations, *Grad/C&C* and *Engage & Collab* objectives were “met” at higher rates, 56% and 54% respectively, than other objectives of which less than 50% of objectives were “met” for each pillar. While the academic objectives (i.e., *ELA*, *Math*, and *Other Academic Content*) showed higher rates of “N/A” evaluations, *Joy & Wellness* and *EL Programs* had more room for improvement, as more than half of these objectives were “not met.”

A similar pattern can be seen when examining the percentage of improvement objectives “met” by each school type (Figure 8), where fewer than half were “met” by most school types. The only exception was special education schools (n=10), which “met” a relatively higher percentage of their objectives than other school types. On the other hand, middle schools (n=82) had the most room for improvement, with 64% of objectives “not met,” and Span schools (n=37) had the highest proportion of objectives with “N/A” evaluations (21%).

Figure 7: Percent of Improvement Objectives Met by SPSA Pillar

Smarter Balanced Assessments

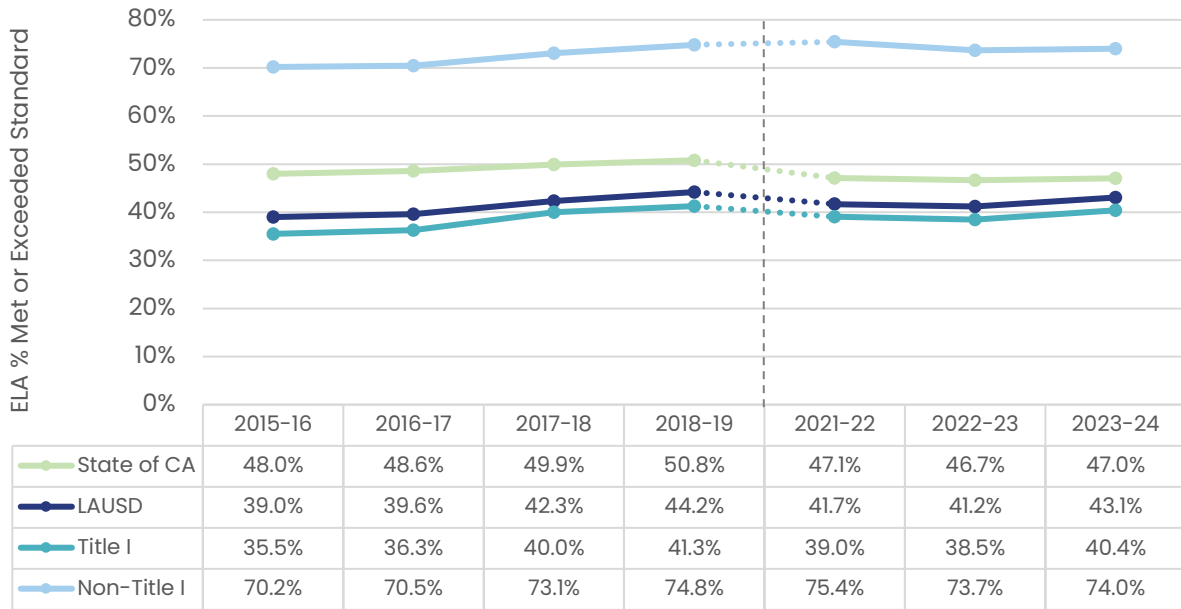
Smarter Balanced (SBA; formerly SBAC) summative assessments measure student achievement and growth in ELA and math. They are administered each spring to students statewide in grades 3-8 and 11 beginning in 2014-15. SBA results as percentage of students who met or exceeded standard across all grade levels statewide, for LAUSD, and for Title I versus non-Title I schools are summarized for ELA and math in Figures 9 and 10 below, respectively. SBAs were not administered in the 2019-20 academic year and were only administered to a limited non-representative number of students in 2020-21. Therefore, results are not reported for those years.

The initial statewide improvement overtime from 2015-16 to the year pre-COVID 2018-19 (+2.8 percentage points in ELA and +2.7 percentage points in math), had all but disappeared post-COVID. The overall percent of students meeting or exceeding standards for the state in 2021-22 (47.1% for ELA and 33.4% for math) dropped below the percent meeting or exceeding standards in 2015-16, the second year of SBA testing (48% for ELA and 37% for math).

In comparison to the statewide results (ELA was -0.1 percentage points and Math +2.1 percentage points), LAUSD students overall and in Title I schools met-or-exceeded standards at lower rates but had more growth pre-COVID from 2015-16 to 2018-19 (+5.2 percentage points in ELA and +5.5 percentage points in mathematics) and less decline during COVID on both the ELA and math SBA (percent met or exceeded standard in 2021-22 did not drop below results of 2015-16). Furthermore, LAUSD students have shown greater improvements on average, post-COVID than students statewide, with Title I schools showing nearly the same rate of

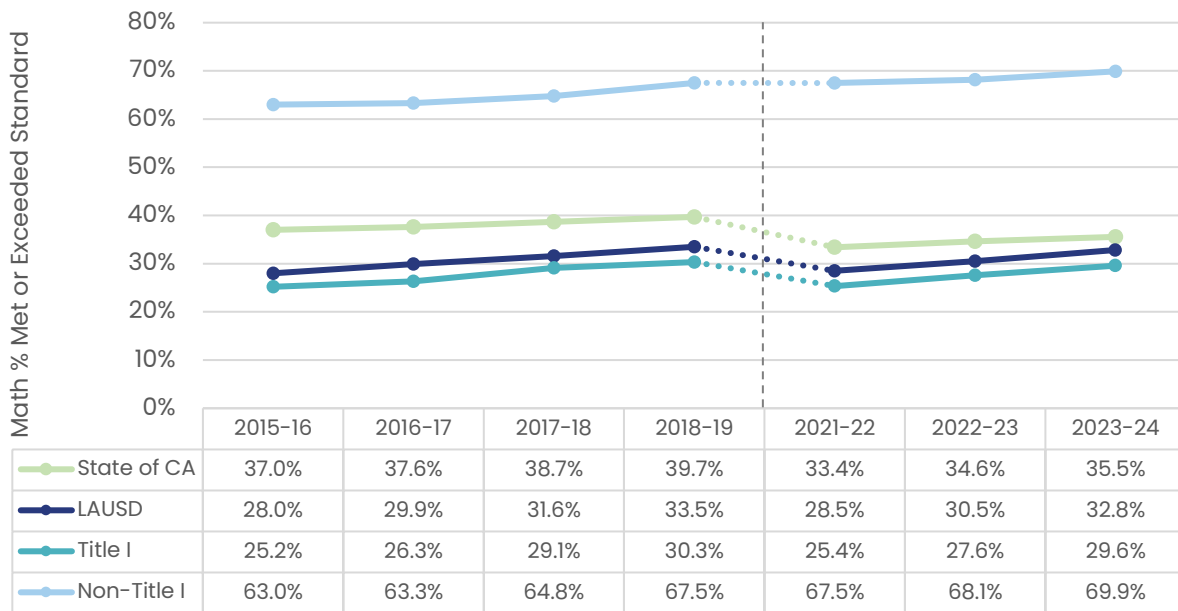
improvement as LAUSD overall. From 2021-22 (the first year post-COVID) to 2023-24 the percentage of LAUSD students who met or exceeded standard increased by 1.4 percentage points in ELA (from 41.7% to 43.1%) and by 4.3 percentage points in math (from 28.5% to 32.8%). Similarly, students at Title I schools who met or exceeded standard increased by 1.4 percentage points in ELA (from 39% to 40.4%) and by 4.2 percentage points in math (from 25.4% to 29.6%).

Discussion

In prior years, we left all *Grad/C&C* objectives for schools for which those objectives were optional or not applicable (e.g., Elementary and Middle schools). This year, we removed them before any analyses. In removing “blank” and “Not Applicable (N/A)” objectives, we uncovered potential input errors, in which elementary schools tagged multiple objectives as *Grad/C&C* that were unrelated. This is evidence that the SPSA process is inconsistent across schools and sometimes leads to inaccuracies. In years prior to the addition of the *Other Academic Content* category, elementary and middle schools used the *Grad/C&C* category as a catch-all. However, since the addition of *Other Academic Content* category, schools have been slow to adopt using this category for those objectives unrelated to the other categories provided.

Looking Ahead

This report provides only a snapshot of the quantity of objectives developed by different schools and an idea of what school staff value based on those numbers. A previously recommended cross comparison of quantity (objective “met” rates) and quality (what/how objectives are created) analysis is currently underway. Looking at strategies used in relation to quantity and quality may also be included. Results will be provided as a supplemental report to LAUSD’s Federal and State Education Programs (FSEP) team to utilize for training Title I

coordinators and school sites. More specifically, *how* and the *extent to which* SSC teams are creating high-quality and realistic/attainable objectives (i.e., S.M.A.R.T. goals).

Additional future analyses could include understanding how school sites differentiate implementation from improvement objectives for developing SSC training or analyzing the responses for certain subsets of schools for developing the SPSA template. More specifically, examining responses for subsets of schools that did not meet implementation but did meet improvement objectives, or conversely, for schools that did not meet improvement, but did meet implementation objectives. The SPSA offers a rich source of information to inform school improvement.
