Approval of Facilities Contract Actions August 21, 2018 Procurement Services Division - Facilities Contracts

Action Proposed:

Staff proposes that the Board of Education (Board) ratify the Procurement Services Division (PSD) contract actions taken by Facilities Contracts under delegated authority as listed in Attachment "A" including: award of advertised construction contracts, including Best Value solicitation; award of job order contract amendments; approval of change orders; completion of contracts; award of informal contracts; award of architectural and engineering contracts; and extra services / amendments for architectural and engineering contracts; and approve the proposed contract actions as listed in Attachment "B" including: approval of professional / technical services capacity increase; and approval of professional / technical services contracts.

Background:

Facilities Contracts staff prepares monthly reports for contract actions necessary for the execution of projects approved by the Board and contained in the FSD Strategic Execution Plan (SEP), and for the maintenance and operation of District facilities in accordance with District policies and Board-delegated authority. As described in the November 12, 2013 Board Report #048-13/14 Informative, detailed information is provided on the Facilities Services website.

Expected Outcomes:

Approval of these items will allow services provided by these contracts to proceed in support of FSD projects, District policies and goals, and the Board-approved FSD-SEP.

Board Options and Consequences:

The Board can approve all actions presented or postpone selected actions pending receipt of additional information. Non-ratification of actions awarded under delegated authority in Attachment "A" will result in the immediate discontinuance of services. While non-ratification may be legally defendable, it will likely result in costly litigation over discontinued payments or if the District attempts to reclaim payments made to a vendor. District costs will likely increase as fewer contractors compete for future procurements.

Policy Implications:

This action does not change District policy and conforms to *California Education Code section 17604* that permits the Board of Education to delegate authority for Facilities Contracts (Board Report #444-17/18), which the Board exercised on May 08, 2018.

Budget Impact:

The contract actions presented are within the budget authority previously approved by the Board. Unless indicated otherwise, all contract actions are Bond funded.

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Student Impact:

The contract actions will help ensure that the students are provided with safe and healthy environments, and up-to-date facilities that promote learning.

Issues and Analysis:

There are no policy implications on these agreements.

Facilities/Student Impact:

The contract actions will help ensure that students are provided with safe and healthy learning environments that promote learning.

Why is this necessary?

Facilities design and construction workload has significantly increased and is anticipated to continue on an upward trend. These material testing & inspection design services will provide additional capability for Repair and Modernization, Critical Repair, Seismic Retrofit, Proposition 39, ADA Barrier Removal Program and Division of State Architect (DSA) certification programs.

Why do we need to do this now?

The current Board-approved aggregate contract value is \$16 Million. This request will increase the aggregate contract value by an additional \$14 Million for a total capacity of \$30 Million. Project Execution (PEX) and Asset Management have been actively using these services due to the increasing volume of material testing & inspection services. Awarding this additional aggregate amount will enable Facilities to continue supporting the ongoing and anticipated workload for capital improvement and maintenance projects.

What would happen if this were not approved?

Facilities improvement and maintenance programs may be disrupted due to an insufficient number of Materials Testing firms to support the increased volume of construction work.

What are the terms of the proposed agreement?

The authority to increase or decrease individual amounts for these formally competed contracts will be limited to the total aggregate amount of \$30 million through October 31, 2020.

Introduction

Maintenance and Operations is requesting the Board of Education's approval to award Contract No 1990002/4400006756 and Contract No 1990002/4400006757 for the laboratory services to analyze drinking water samples from sites throughout the District.

Why is this necessary?

This contract will provide the lowest overall competitive cost for drinking water sample analysis by a certified testing laboratory.

Why do we need to do this now?

These contracts will help support the completion of the Phase II Program to Mitigate Lead In Drinking Water to Eliminate the Need for Daily Flushing of Fixtures at All District School Sites per BOE report 017-15/16 dated 9/1/15. These contracts will additionally support the ongoing need to sample new and replaced drinking water sources throughout the District.

What would happen if this were not approved?

If this contract is not approved, there would be an increased administrative cost and burden to the Maintenance & Operations Branch for the procurement of drinking water sample analysis.
