Approval of Facilities Contracts Actions February 8, 2022 Procurement Services Division - Facilities Contracts

Action Proposed:

Ratify the Procurement Services Division (PSD) contract actions taken by Facilities Contracts under delegated authority as listed in Attachment "A" including: award of advertised construction contracts; approval of change orders; completion of contracts; award of informal contracts; extra services / amendments for architectural and engineering contracts; and approve the proposed contract actions as listed in Attachment "B" including: approval of task order contracts; approval of apprenticeship training program; approval of public safety voice radio communication systems modernization contracts; approval of professional services contracts.

Background:

Facilities Contracts staff prepares monthly reports for contract actions necessary for the execution of projects approved by the Board and contained in the FSD Strategic Execution Plan (SEP), and for the maintenance and operation of District facilities in accordance with District policies and Board-delegated authority. As described in the November 12, 2013 Board Report #048-13/14 Informative, detailed information is provided on the Facilities Services website.

Expected Outcomes:

Approval of these items will allow services provided by these contracts to proceed in support of FSD projects, District policies and goals, and the Board-approved FSD-SEP.

Board Options and Consequences:

The Board can approve all actions presented or postpone selected actions pending receipt of additional information. Non-ratification of actions awarded under delegated authority in Attachment "A" will result in the immediate discontinuance of services. While non-ratification may be legally defendable, it will likely result in costly litigation over discontinued payments or if the District attempts to reclaim payments made to a vendor. District costs will likely increase as fewer contractors compete for future procurements.

Policy Implications:

This action does not change District policy and conforms to California Education Code section 17604 that permits the Board of Education to delegate authority for Facilities Contracts (Board Report #444-17/18), which the Board exercised on May 08, 2018.

Budget Impact:

The contract actions presented are within the budget authority previously approved by the Board. Unless indicated otherwise, all contract actions are Bond funded.

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Student Impact:

The contract actions will help ensure that the students are provided with safe and healthy environments, and up to-date facilities that promote learning.

Equity Impact:

Not applicable.

Issues and Analysis:

There are no policy implications on these agreements.

Student Impact:

Facilities operated by the Los Angeles Unified School District must be in compliance with state and local regulations governing fire, life/safety system testing requirements to maintain a safe, legally compliant learning environment.

Equity Impact:

Not Applicable.

Introduction:

The Los Angeles Unified School District is one of the largest landlords in the County of Los Angeles. The District is responsible for maintaining compliance with fire and life/safety regulations of more than 12 agencies including the City of Los Angeles (Fire Chief's Regulation #4), the County of Los Angeles, and various local city ordinances promulgated by the communities that are served. These requirements vary slightly however, they are based upon the National Fire Protection Agency, a national sanctioning body that requires annual and semi-annual testing and repair of life safety systems.

Why is this necessary?

It is necessary for the Board to ratify these agreements because if it is not approved the District will face extreme challenges in maintaining the repair and certification of legally required fire suppression building components, potentially leaving students and staff lives at risk.

Why do we need to do this now?

The Inspection Department's FLSTG group needs multiple contractors to achieve needed repairs and certifications as the present available resources are inadequate. There is a continuous need to provide repair and certification services. The ability to contract urgent demands for repairs certifications at a reduced cost will help minimize disruption to the students' learning and exercise environments.

What would happen if this were not approved?

By denying the Inspection Department the tools required to meet compliance Districtwide, the regulatory agencies tasked with enforcement of regulations will be forced to issue non-compliance citations and, ultimately, students and staff safety will be compromised.

What are the terms of the proposed agreement?

The awarded contracts will be for one (1) year with four (4) one-year renewal options. Funding will be provided on an as-needed basis utilizing 100% Restricted Maintenance Funds.

Students benefit by having a safe educational environment centered on academic success, which includes providing well-maintained schools that facilitate the highest standard of learning.

Introduction: The Facilities Services Division is requesting the Board of Education to approve Agreement No. 2290010-4400010072, a capacity contract, for apprentice training services to be provided by the JJATC and Refrigeration Training Center in support of the Heating, Ventilation, and Air Conditioning (HVAC) Apprenticeship Training Program.

The Apprenticeship Training Program was approved by the Board on October 11, 2011 (Board Report No. 075-11/12). In partnership with the LA/Orange County Building Trades Council, this program provides District employees with a first-rate education and on-the-job training in a highly specialized and in-demand building trades craft. Under the terms of the Letter of Agreement, the District and each signatory Craft Union therein must enter into separate agreements with each other. Accordingly, the District engaged the JJATC Air Conditioning and Refrigeration Training Center to provide apprenticeship training services for the HVAC Apprenticeship Training Program.

We currently have 30 open Heating and Air Conditioning journeyperson positions to fill. Nine apprentices are enrolled in their fifth year of the training program and 11 are enrolled in the first year. Upon the successful completion of the five-year training program, District apprentices will be qualified to be hired as journeypersons. Highly trained individuals are needed to repair and maintain the District's facility portfolio consisting of 68,000 pieces of HVAC equipment and over 30,000 air-conditioned classrooms.

JJATC is currently working via a Limited Notice to Proceed (NTP) for \$200,000 and is awaiting approval of this contract.

Why is this necessary? There is a continuous need for HVAC journeypersons District-wide due to the overwhelming demand to address heating and cooling repairs of the educational spaces and other occupied spaces critical to the learning environment.

Why do we need to do this now? Due to regular attrition and promotions, the District must maintain qualified staff for the high demand for HVAC repairs.

What would happen if this were not approved? If this contract is not approved, there would be an increased administrative cost and burden to the Maintenance & Operations Branch to procure and outsource authorized HVAC journeypersons. Classrooms would not have a conducive learning environment and there would be an increase in classrooms closures.

The District would be unable to pay JJATC Air Conditioning and Refrigeration Training Center; therefore, the HVAC Apprenticeship Training Program would be suspended.

What are the terms of the proposed agreement? The JJATC will provide training for apprentices over the life of the five-year Agreement.

The total cost of the program is \$1,700,000 for the entire duration of the Agreement. This amount will be paid by 20% Bond and 80% Restricted Maintenance Funds.

Student Impact:

District school sites will be able to directly reach School Police or other designated response personnel when other communications such as phones may be down. The system also serves both daily and emergency radio communications for school buses and transportation (1680), Los Angeles School Police vehicles, handhelds, and base radios (1063), Emergency services, Maintenance & Operations, and other staff radio users (300). This project will cover 710 square miles which includes the City of Los Angeles, along with all or portions of 26 cities and unincorporated areas of Los Angeles County. All LAUSD and dependent school sites are included in the proposed contract, currently at (842) locations to be covered for emergency communications on the new system.

Introduction:

The Information Technology Division (ITD) is requesting Board approval of a contract to modernize radio communication systems serving all LAUSD schools, transportation systems, the Los Angeles School Police Department, and other divisions. The system will provide both daily use and emergency communication throughout the LAUSD area to improve communication with a public safety grade system that is interoperable with other regional public safety agency and integrated with cellular and IP based telephone systems, ensuring we have reliable communication systems in place to ensure the safety of our school communities.

Why is this necessary?

The District's radios systems are aging with obsolete technology that cannot meet current safety demands. There are two separate systems that are not interoperable nor compatible with one another and do not integrate with other communication systems. Capacity of the system is limited and some equipment has reached end of life which can no longer be supported by manufacturers/vendors. Additionally, the current radio communication systems do not meet the

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emergency communication needs of District school sites. Systems are below current standards of reliability and are no longer supported by manufacturers/vendors. Without reliable communications equipment, schools are increasingly vulnerable during times of emergency as time passes without modernization.

Why do we need to do this now?

On August 24, 2021, the Board of Education authorized ITD and FSD to complete the competitive negotiation process to solicit and select a qualified vendor to provide a fully functional radio communication system to meet the daily and emergency communication needs of the District. The agreement will provide all necessary design work, equipment, installation, and training services. This proposed board action will complete the procurement process and allow for project execution.

What would happen if this were not approved?

Without approval, the procurement process cannot finish and ITD would not able to proceed with projects critical for modernization of radio communication systems. Schools will continue to rely on aging and outdated emergency communications systems; leaving students and staff unnecessarily vulnerable during emergencies and times of crisis.

What are the terms of the proposed agreement?

The proposed agreement will be for a period of five (5) years. The not to exceed contract value is \$20,601,700. Source of funding will be from 100% Bond funds approved by voters with Measure Q and Measure Y, specifically designated for communications systems modernization projects.

Introduction:

The Information Technology Division (ITD) is requesting Board approval of a contract to provide a Computer Aided Dispatch, Records Management System (CAD/RMS) serving all LASPD in order to better serve the students and staff of LAUSD. The system will provide daily operational use and emergency crisis support for LASPD in order to improve efficiency in dispatching and maintaining confidential records. The system is cloud-based and meets security requirements for public safety use. This system will replace an aging system and add new efficiencies in CAD/RMS that do not currently exist in the District. This new system will be integrated into the Radio Modernization Project.

Why is this necessary?

The District's police department has an aging CAD/RMS. This new system will modernize and update the systems while improving efficiencies. The new system is cloud-based and will provide improved access and security to the records management system.

Why do we need to do this now?

The current radio communication system is being upgraded and modernized in another project at this time. The CAD/RMS will integrate with the modernized radio system and will be operationally tied to one another. The current CAD/RMS are in need of replacement due to age and lack of necessary functionality. Performing the upgrades to the radio system and the CAD/RMS together ensures the best integration and minimizes additional costs to integrate at different times.

Introduction

The above referenced Master Service Agreements (MSAs) are scheduled for Board action on February 8, 2022. To support the Facilities Services Division's (FSD) School Upgrade Program, Modernizations, Seismic Retrofits and Americans with Disability Act upgrades, the District will need to maintain its pool of qualified environmental MSA Contractors. The Procurement Services Division completed a new contract procurement process in January 2022, which will ensure competitive pricing, and timely performance of California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) reviews in support of District projects.

A total of 13 firms submitted 30 proposals for CEQA services and Special Studies. The Board is being asked to authorize negotiation and execution of the Contracts at this time to ensure no lapse of CEQA services as the current MSA Contracts will expire on March 31, 2022.

Why is this necessary?

The MSA Contractors provide the professional services required to assist the District in completing the necessary environmental studies in order maintain compliance with CEQA Guidelines in support of District projects. Services to be provided include the development of appropriate CEQA documents up to and including Environmental Impact Reports (EIRs) and Special Studies (Air Quality Studies, Biological Surveys, Cultural Resource Assessments, and Noise/Vibration Studies,).

Why do we need to do this now?

The current California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Master Services Agreements will expire on March 31, 2022.

What would happen if this were not approved?

Failure to secure new contracts will directly impact the School Upgrade Program schedule for project start-up, evaluation, construction, and completion of proposed projects. In addition, the District would not be in compliance with CEQA.

What are the terms of the proposed agreement?

The Procurement Services Division Board Report No. 170-21/22 includes a recommendation for authorization to negotiate and execute thirteen (13) California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Master Service Agreements for a total "Not-to-Exceed" (NTE) aggregate of \$10 Million. The initial contract period for all agreements is April 1, 2022 through March 31, 2025 with two (2) one-year renewal options. The funding source is 85% Bond Funds, 15% General Funds.
