The Sacramento Valley Charter School (“School”) welcomes your participation at the School’s Board meetings. The purpose of a public meeting of the Board of Directors (“Board”) is to conduct the affairs of the School in public. Your participation assures us of continuing community interest in our School. 2. Members of the public who wish to speak on any agenda items or under the general category of “Oral Communications” will need to attend the meeting in person.
 - a. “Oral Communications” is set aside for members of the audience to raise issues that are not specifically on the agenda. However, due to public meeting laws, the Board can only listen to your issue, not respond or take action. These presentations are limited to three (3) minutes* and total time allotted to non-agenda items will not exceed fifteen (15) minutes. The Board may give direction to staff to respond to your concern or you may be offered the option of returning with a citizen-requested item.
 - b. With regard to a specific agenda item, you will be given an opportunity to speak for up to three (3) minutes* when the Board discusses that item.

Any person wishing to speak is asked to complete a Request to Speak Form which will be available at the meeting. Speakers are asked to state their full name when it is their turn to speak on an “Oral Communication” or a specific agenda item and adhere to the time limits set forth. *Persons requiring an interpreter shall receive a maximum of six (6) minutes.

A. BUSINESS (10 minutes)

3. Review and approve \$1,825 quote for the petting zoo at the school carnival.
4. Review and approve a Promethean board with installation for the Instructional Coach at a cost not to exceed \$5,000.

B. CURRICULUM AND INSTRUCTION (15 minutes)

1. Review and approve the purchase of McGraw Hill multi-year license for curriculum and instructional materials not to exceed \$ _____.
2. Review and approve the purchase of Teacher Created Materials (TCM) for Summer Blast, not to exceed \$25,000 with ELOP funding. The same materials were used successfully last summer.
3. Review and approve the purchase of Summer Bridge Packets for TK – 8th grades for \$6,000. The Packets contain workbooks, flashcards, and other items to help alleviate summer learning loss. The same or similar materials were sent home with scholars last year on the last day of school. There will be an incentive for scholars who return their completed workbooks in the Fall.
4. Approve the revisions to the 2026-27 instructional calendar to change December 16 from a half day of school to a full school day and change December 18 from a full day of school to a half day of school.

1. Review and approve the revised Clerical Assistant job description with more details about support provided to the budget and accounting function.

instructional days, for a limited time while the employee completes the required units to be placed as an IA II.

7. Consider and take action on S. Nijjar's request for a \$750/year additional pay retro to 2019-20 for "recognition of (her) efforts in teaching additional Punjabi classes for 2 1/2 years without any extra compensation".
8. Consider and take action on the Assistant Principal's request for a raise and additional duty days for 2026-27.
9. Review and approve adding an Instructional Aide II or III in the TK program for the 2026-27 school year for a total of two IAs and one teacher.
